BIG WEEK FOR BEANTOWN TEAMS UML sweeps; UMass, UVM split; NU wins, ties

New Hampshire took a step closer to a regular season title by garnering a single point in two games, and Boston University and Boston College were looking like serious playoff contenders with big weekend wins. In a late surge, UMass Lowell put itself into playoff contention with a week-end sweep of Merrimack, while UMass showed it was road worthy with a split at Vermont.

BU twice erased deficits as they took a win and a tie out of a home-and-home series with the Wildcats. On Friday, BU wiped out a Mike Radja (Yorkville, IL) first-period strike and rode two goals from Brandon Yip (Maple Ridge, BC) to a 4-2 win in Durham, NH. On Saturday, at the Agganis Arena, UNH stormed to a 3-0 lead, but the Terriers fought back, and managed a come-from-behind 3-3 tie behind John Curry's (Shorewood, MN) career-high 43 saves. Peter MacArthur (Clifton Park, NY) got the game-tying goal, capping a week that saw BU collect its 28th Beanpot trophy.

At Chestnut Hill, Boston College blitzed Maine on Thursday, 5-2, and then hung on for dear life to capture a breathtaking 6-5 win in the rematch on Friday. The Eagles had jumped to a 4-2 lead in

the second period before the Black Bears tied it in the third. But late tallies by Brian Boyle (Hingham, MA) and Nathan Gerbe (Oxford, MI) put the Eagles ahead to stay, though Josh Soares (Hamilton, ON) got Maine to within one, 6-5.

UMass briefly jumped into 4th place in the league standings on Friday with a 3-2 win at Gutterson Fieldhouse, on goals by Will Ortiz (Framingham, MA), David Leaderer (Rochester, NY) and Chris Capraro (Medford, MA). The Catamounts responded the next night, however, riding junior Joe Fallon's (Bemidji, MN) 17th career shutout to a 3-0 victory and sole possession of fourth place by the end of the weekend, but only by a point.

Northeastern didn't hurt its playoff position, with a win and a tie against Providence. The big push came from UMass Lowell, which is riding red-hot goaltender Nevin Hamilton (Ashland, MA) and finished the week in a tie for the 8th and final playoff spot with Providence, with three league games remaining. The Friars hold the tie-breaker, having won the season series between the teams. In two wins over MC, freshman Hamilton only allowed two goals, and picked up his third shutout.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Senior forward Brian Boyle (Hingham, MA) recorded back-to-back three-point outings in two wins over Maine ... On Friday, Boston College retired the jersey of Bernie Burke, Class of 1950, an All-America goaltender who served as captain of BC's 1949 National Championship team and was a long-time Eagle freshman coach.

Boston University: BU is 10-0-1 in its last 11 contests away from Agganis Arena ... With his two victories in goal this week, senior John Curry tied and then passed Tom Noble '98 for fourth place on the Terriers' win list with 56 ... No team in the country has fewer losses than BU this season (Minnesota and Notre Dame also have five) ... The Terriers are 8-2-4 against ranked opponents this season.

University of Maine: The 6-5 loss on Friday to BC marked the second time this season Maine has scored four or more goals in a game and lost. Maine is 13-2-0 in games when scoring 4+ goals ... With one more win, the program will get its ninth-straight 20-win season, the 20th in the history of Maine hockey ... This weekend series against Merrimack will mark the final home games for six Black Bear seniors.

University of Massachusetts: Ten Minutemen have either surpassed or met their season points total from all of last season ... Three of the last four regular season games will be played at the Mullins Center ... Will Ortiz (Framingham, MA) registered a two-point game in the 3-2 win over Vermont, scoring the first goal of the game and assisting on the second. The rookie is fourth overall among his teammates in scoring with 19 points.

UMass Lowell: The River Hawks earned their first weekend and series sweep last weekend with two wins over MC ... The two wins also extended the River Hawks' winning streak to four games ... Nevin Hamilton recorded his third shutout in four games Friday ... Hamilton's shutout streak reached 187 minutes and 45 seconds before allowing a second period goal Saturday.

Merrimack College: Freshmen Pat Kimball (Framingham, MA) and Matt Jones (Kentwood, MI) are tied for the team lead in goals with four ... All four on Jones' goals this season have come against University of Massachusetts affiliates. He has three against UMass Amherst and one against UMass Lowell ... The Warriors scored two goals for the first time in 10 games on Saturday in their 3-2 loss to UML.

University of New Hampshire: UNH managed six goals against the nation's top-ranked defense last weekend ... Coach Umile needs five wins for 400 career coaching victories...UNH is the only team in Hockey East that has clinched home ice for the quarterfinals ...The 'Cats are undefeated in four all-time games at Agganis Arena (2-0-2).

Northeastern University: Brad Thiessen (Aldergrove, BC) posted his fourth shutout, a 3-0 win over Providence, on Friday. That moved him into second in shutouts in a season for Northeastern. Keni Gibson has the record of five, which he set in 2003-04 ... The Huskies now have four times as many wins as last season, when NU went 3-24-7.

Providence College: The Friars recorded a season-high 48 shots in a 3-3 tie Saturday versus NU ... PC has recorded 40 shots or more in a game in three out of the last four games ... Sophomore Cody Wild (North Providence, MA) has four goals over his last nine contests ... Sophomore goalie Chris Mannix (Hubbardston, MA) made a career-high 15 saves on Friday versus NU in a relief effort.

University of Vermont: With four regular season games remaining, the Catamounts are in fourth place in Hockey East with 26 points ... Vermont's penalty kill, which ranks second best in the nation, held UMass to 0-for-8 on the power play last weekend.

Boston College Coach **Jerry York** won his 300th game at the helm of the Eagles with Friday's 6-5 win over Maine. York is the third person in BC hockey history to reach this milestone.

Torrey Mitchell, UVM (Jr. F; Greenfield Park, QC) Recorded the 100th point of his career with an assist on Friday against UMass to become the 40th Catamount in school history to reach the century mark.

Josh Soares, Maine (Sr. F; Hamilton, ON) reached the 100 career point milestone with a shorthanded goal in the first period on February 15 at Boston College. He is the 47th Black Bear to reach the 100-point milestone.

Billy Ryan, Maine (Jr. F; Milton, MA) and **Bret Tyler, Maine** (Jr. D; Maynard, Mass.) both reach 100 career games played on February 16, 2007, at Boston College.

Steve Birnstill, NU (Sr. F; Commack, NY) Got his 50th career assist in NU's 3-0 win over Providence on February 16, 2007. at Matthews Arena.

Tony Morrone, Maine (Fr. F; West Palm Beach, FL) Notched his first collegiate point with an assist on February 16, 2007, at Boston College.
