TOP SEEDS HEAD TO THE GARDEN UMass joins returning teams BU, BC and UNH

The four home teams advanced to the TD Banknorth Garden for the third consecutive year as Hockey East quarterfinal play concluded this past weekend. Only #3 seed Boston University was forced to play a third game, but the Terriers got an overtime goal from Brandon Yip (Maple Ridge, BC) on Saturday night to deny #6 Vermont in its bid to reach Friday's semifinals.

#1 UNH defeated #8 Providence, 4-0 and 6-0: Junior goalie Kevin Regan (So. Boston, MA) pitched a pair of 42-save shutouts and junior forward Mike Radja (Yorkville, IL) set up five goals on the weekend as the Wildcats eliminated the Friars. In the second game, sophomore Tom Fortney (Webster Groves, MO) led the UNH charge with a pair of goals, and senior defenseman Chris Murray (Dover, MA) added a goal and two assists.

#2 BC defeated #7 Northeastern, 3-0 and 7-1: Another junior netminder played a key role in his team advancing. BC's Cory Schneider (Marblehead, MA) was beaten just once in two nights as the Eagles dispatched the Huskies. Schneider's 25-save, 3-0 shutout on Friday was the 14th of his career, establishing a new BC career mark. (Scott

Clemmensen held the old record.) Brock Bradford (Burnaby, BC) led all HE scorers with three goals. Nathan Gerbe (Oxford, MI) and Brett Motherwell (St. Charles, IL) each had five helpers. Motherwell's four assists in the Eagles' 7-1 victory Friday tied a Hockey East tournament record.

#3 BU defeated #6 Vermont, 2-3, 2-0, 3-2 (OT): The Catamounts played stingy defense for three nights but in the end, a PPG decided the series. On Thursday, UVM had more energy and parlayed it into a 3-2 win. On Friday, John Curry (Shorewood, MN) was at his best in a 29-save shutout. Saturday's deciding game had a BU hue to it for much of the night, the Terriers going up 2-0. But UVM fought back to tie the game, sending it to OT. A penalty on a BU breakaway led to Yip's game-winning goal.

#4 UMass defeated #5 Maine, 3-2 and 5-2: It isn't easy beating a team four times in two weeks. The Minutemen did it without a loss in eliminating the Black Bears. Eight different UMass players scored goals and Jon Quick (Hamden, CT) stopped 73 of 77 shots. The crowds of 7,119 and 8,062 at the Mullins Center set quarterfinal records.

HONOR ROLL

Cory Schneider, BC (Jr. G; Marblehead, MA) – Stopped 46-of-47 shots (.979 save percentage) and recorded a 0.53 goals against average in leading No. 2 seed BC to a two-game series sweep of seventh-seeded Northeastern.

Peter Lenes, UVM (So. F; Shelburne, VT) – Scored two goals and had one assist in Vermont's three-game Hockey East quarterfinals series against BU.

Ben Smith, BC (Fr. F; Avon, CT) – Registered his first multiple-point performance (1 goal, 1 assist) of his career in the team's 3-0 victory over Northeastern on Thursday.

Pete MacArthur, BU (Jr. F; Clifton Park, NY) – Figured in the scoring in all three games against Vermont (1 goal, 3 assists) to reach the 100-point career mark.

Mike Radja, UNH (Jr. F; Yorkville, IL) – Recorded five assists in the quarterfinal round against Providence.

John Curry, BU (Sr. G; Shorewood, MN) – Recorded his nation-best seventh shutout of the year to tie the BU career record of 13 shutouts. Posted a 1.60 goals against average and a .939 save percentage in the quarterfinals.

Teddy Purcell, Maine (Fr. F; St. John's, NF) – Had a power play goal and an assist on Saturday at UMass.

Brandon Yip, BU (So. F; Maple Ridge, BC) – Tallied the overtime game winner in the decisive third game... Also assisted on the game-winning goal in the Terriers' 2-0 victory on Friday.

Brock Bradford, BC (So. F; Burnaby, BC) – Recorded three goals and two assists in pacing second-seeded Boston College to a two-game series sweep of NU.

BU's **Chris Higgins** (So. F; Lynnfield, MA) and **Jason Lawrence** (So. F; Saugus, MA) – Each scored a first-period goal in Saturday's clincher after both earning an assist in Friday's 2-0 victory.

Brett Hemingway, UNH (Sr., F, Surrey, BC) – Posted three points on the week, including two goals and one assist in the series vs. Providence. Hemingway notched the game-winner on Thursday night in the series opener.

Brian Boyle, BC (Sr. F; Hingham, MA) – Tallied at least one point in each of BC's wins over the weekend and extending his point-scoring streak to five games.

Benn Ferriero, BC (So. F; Essex, MA) – Registered four points – two power-play goals and two assists – in the team's 7-1 home win on Friday.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: In 58 playoff games over the last nine years, Boston College is 44-14 (.759 win percentage) ... Junior goalie Cory Schneider (Marblehead, MA) recorded 25 saves in the team's 3-0 home win over Northeastern on Friday night to break the BC record with his 14th career shutout. Schneider surpassed Scott Clemmensen, who recorded 13 shutouts from 1997-01.

Boston University: Sophomore Brandon Yip (Maple Ridge, BC) is the first player in Hockey East history to score two overtime goals in the league playoffs ... In all, 13 different Terriers earned at least one point in the quarterfinals ... Friday's 2-0 victory was the team's eighth shutout of the season, tying a BU record ... BU hasn't lost at home to the same team on consecutive days since Nov. 20-21, 1992.

University of Maine: The Black Bears failed to advance to the Hockey East semifinals for the first time since 2003, when they were also defeated by Massachusetts in the quarterfinals ... Maine scored on three of 11 power play chances, giving the Black Bears 55 power play goals on the season, which leads the nation.

University of Massachusetts: Head Coach Don "Toot" Cahoon earned his 100th win at Massachusetts on Saturday with the 5-2 win over Maine ... UMass' 20 wins on the season is a program best under Hockey East affiliations ... John Wessbecker (Victoria, MN) scored his first collegiate goal in Friday's 3-2 win over Maine ... UMass' six-game winning streak is the second-longest in the nation (NCAA DI).

University of New Hampshire: Coach Umile needs only two wins to become the eighth active head coach with 400 career coaching wins ... UNH has faced the Minutemen four times in the Hockey East Tournament, and twice in the semifinals, with each team winning once ... The Wildcats boast the country's 4th-ranked offense (3.69) and the 6th-ranked defense (2.22).

Northeastern: Brad Thiessen (Aldergrove, BC) set the NU single-season record for save percentage (.921) and had the second-best single-season goals against average (2.48) in NU history. He also set a NU record for shutouts by a freshman, with four ... Northeastern posted a 10-win improvement in 2006-07, the fourth-best improvement in team history.

Providence College: Senior co-captain Tony Zancanaro (Trenton, MI) finished tied for eighth all-time at PC in career games played with 146. Zancanaro never missed a game in his four seasons ... The Friars outshot their opponents in 30 of the 36 games, including an 84-50 edge against UNH in the quarterfinals.

University of Vermont: Vermont finished the season with 18 wins, matching last season's total ... Vermont played 22 of its 39 games against ranked teams ... The Catamounts went 1-2-6 in overtime games this year ... Vermont split the season series against BU at three games apiece.
