## BC EAGLES SOAR TO CHAMPIONSHIP Five HE squads invited to NCAA Tournament

The Boston College Eagles rode their late-season momentum right through the Hockey East Championships, sweeping four straight playoff games to take their 7<sup>th</sup> league crown. BC sophomore Brock Bradford (Burnaby, BC), who registered six goals of the tournament, including the game-winning strike in Saturday's 5-2 victory over UNH, was named the Most Valuable Player for the Championships. All four semifinalists and Maine were selected for the field of 16 in the NCAA Tournament beginning next weekend.

On Saturday, the red-hot Eagles jumped out to a 2-0 lead on the Wildcats in a wild first period (32 shots on net), and never looked back, eventually building a 4-0 cushion before UNH rallied in the third. BC's Matt Greene (Plymouth, MA) opened the scoring just past the midway point of the opening stanza, and sophomore Benn Ferriero (Essex, MA) doubled the lead with two minutes left. Bradford got the game-winner with under two minutes in the second period, and Nathan Gerbe finished off a 4-0 break to give the Eagles the eventual insurance tally. UNH stormed back on goals by Bobby Butler (Marlboro, MA) and Trevor Smith (North Vancouver, BC), but wouldn't get another puck past BC's Cory Scheider the rest of the night. Brian Boyle (Hingham, MA) buried an empty-netter to ensure the Eagles their crown.

On Friday, UNH needed extra time to put away a determined UMass squad. The teams finished regulation and the first overtime deadlocked at 2-2. Just

90 seconds into the second OT, however, Butler slapped a shot over UMass goalie Jon Quick (Hamden, CT) for the win. UNH's Kevin Regan (South Boston, MA) finished with 44 saves, while Quick had 38. In the second semifinal, BC blitzed BU, 6-2, burying two goals in each period to eliminate the league's best defensive team. Bradford got a pair, while Ferriero, Ben Smith (Avon, CT), Joe Rooney (Canton, MA) and Nathan Gerbe (Oxford, MI) also scored.

On Selection Sunday, the NCAA kept Hockey East finalists UNH and BC close to home, assigning both to the Northeast Regional at the Verizon Wireless Center in Manchester NH, where UNH will host as the No. 1 seed and play No. 4 Miami on Saturday. BC will carry the No. 2 seed into its Saturday match against No. 3 St. Lawrence. If both UNH and BC advance to Sunday's regional final, it will mark the fourth time the two teams have met in the last three weeks (BC won the last three). Two more Hockey East squads – Massachusetts and Maine – will travel to the Blue Cross Arena in Rochester, NY, and the East Regional. UMass, as 4<sup>th</sup> seed, will lock horns with top-ranked Clarkson, and No. 3 Maine faces St. Cloud State. Again, if both advance, the final will have a familiar look, since UMass and the Black Bears have tangled four times in the past three weeks (with the Minutemen winning all four contests). Boston University garnered the Midwest Regional's No. 2 seed, and will face Michigan State on Friday.

## TEAM NOTES

**Boston College:** The Eagles have earned 27 NCAA Tournament berths, and nine in the last 10 seasons. Snooks Kelley, Len Ceglarski and Jerry York have each led BC to nine NCAA berths ... In the last 13 games, junior Cory Schneider is 12-1-0 with a 1.70 goals against average and a .943 save percentage ... Schneider has registered 999 saves this season. He is one of three BC goalies to make 1,000 saves in a season (1,088 last year). No BC goalie has stopped more than 1,000 shots in multiple seasons ... BC and St. Lawrence have met 65 times, with the Eagles holding the series lead, 34-28-3.

**Boston University:** BU is in the NCAA tournament for the 30th time – tied for second most all-time – and head coach Jack Parker will be bringing his Terriers to the tournament for the 22nd time, tying the national record held by Ron Mason ... The Terriers' regional semifinal versus Michigan State in Grand Rapids will be the team's first game outside of New England since the season opener at RPI ... Junior Pete MacArthur (Clifton Park, NY) has tallied seven points (1-6) during his current five-game point streak ... BU placed three players on the Hockey East First Team for just the second time in program history.

**University of Maine:** The Black Bears have advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the ninth straight season, the second longest active streak behind Michigan's 17 straight seasons ... Maine was a three seed in the East Regional last season and advanced to the Frozen Four ... The Black Bears have only played first round opponent St. Cloud State seven times and Maine has a 5-1-1 record against the Huskies ... Maine has a 28-18 overall record in the NCAA Tournament ... The .609 winning percentage is the seventh-best in the NCAA.

**University of Massachusetts:** The Minutemen earned their first-ever NCAA bid on Sunday, coming in as the No. 4 seed in the East Region. This marks Coach Don "Toot" Cahoon's second NCAA appearance, as he guided Princeton to the tournament during the 1997-98 season.

**University of New Hampshire:** Coach Richard Umile needs only one win for his 400th career victory ... UNH is hosting the NCAA Northeast Regional for the second time in school history ... UNH owns a 12-20 all-time record in the NCAA playoffs, which includes a 10-12 all-time record under Umile ... This will mark the 'Cats 17th appearance in the tournament and the 13th trip under Umile's guidance ... UNH's senior class becomes the fourth class in school history to win a berth in the NCAA's in all four seasons.
