LEAGUE SENDS TWO TO FROZEN FOUR Maine, BC comprise half the NCAA field in St. Louis

Two of the five Hockey East squads invited to the NCAA Tournament will advance to the Frozen Four, as Boston College and Maine captured the Northeast and East Regionals, respectively. BC will ride the momentum of a 12-game winning streak to St. Louis, while Maine, in its ninth straight NCAA appearance, took back-to-back games to secure the East Regional.

Maine was the first to advance Saturday, edging league counterpart Massachusetts on the strength of two power play goals and the solid goaltending of a healthy Ben Bishop (Des Peres, MO). UMass upended No. 1 seed Clarkson in overtime on Kevin Jarman's (Aurora, ON) rebound tally. Sophomore goaltender Jon Quick (Hamden, CT) won a tremendous goaltending duel with Clarkson's David Leggio, stopping all 33 shots that the Golden Knights fired at him. Maine, meanwhile, regrouped after an early St. Cloud goal to put four unanswered goals past Husky Bobby Goepfert, setting up Saturday's match against UMass.

In the final, penalties proved costly for the Minutemen, as the Black Bears leveraged their potent power-play to get a pair of man-advantage markers, including the game-winner by Mike Hamilton (Victoria, BC). Bishop, Michel Leveille

(Levis, QC), Brett Tyler (Maynard, MA) and Mike Lundin (Apple Valley, MN) were tabbed for the All-Regional Team, along with Jarman and Matt Anderson (West Islip, NY) of UMass.

On Sunday, Boston College parlayed a pair of second-period strikes by Joe Rooney (Canton, MA) to bump a fiesty Miami squad, 4-0. BC downed St. Lawrence 4-1 in the second Northeast semifinal, while Miami earned the right to play the Eagles via a hard-fought 2-1 win over No. 1 seed New Hampshire. On Saturday, UNH's Mike Radja (Yorkville, IL) got the Wildcats back within one on a dazzling shorthanded goal, but it would be the last puck to get behind RedHawks' goalie Jeff Zatkoff. In the final, BC's Cory Schneider (Marblehead, MA) was a wall in net, and Kyle Kucharski (Saugus, MA) and Benn Ferriero (Essex, MA) added third-period goals to give the Eagles breathing room after Rooney's twin tallies. Schneider had 37 saves and earned Most Outstanding Player honors, while Rooney, Brian Boyle (Hingham, MA) and Brock Bradford (Burnaby, BC) joined him on the All-Regional Team.

In the Midwest Regional, Boston University lost to eventual bracket champ Michigan State, 5-1, to finish the year at 20-10-9.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: The Eagles got strong support from the BC women's team, who came out in numbers to show their allegiance. The women's team also made it to the NCAA semifinals, losing a heartbreaker to Minnesota-Duluth in double overtime ... The Eagles are 19-7 in the NCAAs under Jerry York ... Since the 1997-98 season, BC has a record of 48-17 (.774) in 62 postseason games, the best among Division I hockey programs ... BC has won its last 12 games, marking the longest winning streak of York's tenure at the Heights ... BC has scored on the power-play 12 straight games and 14 of its last 15 contests.

Boston University: Sophomore defenseman Matt Gilroy (North Bellmore, NY) recorded at least one assist in 12 of the final 16 games of the season... Senior captain Sean Sullivan (Braintree, MA) finishes his career tied for seventh in games played at BU with 155, while classmate Kenny Roche (South Boston, MA) ranks 10th with 154... Senior goaltender John Curry (Shorewood, MN) set the new career standards at BU in both goals against average (2.07) and save percentage (.923).

University of Maine: The Black Bears have advanced to the Frozen Four for the eleventh time in school history, and the fourth time in the last six years ... Junior forward Rob Bellamy (Westfield, MA) scored his first goal of the season against St. Cloud State ... Maine is now 5-0-1 this season on neutral ice ... The Black Bears have not lost a non-conference game this season ... Maine's opponent will be Michigan State, who also has reached the Frozen Four eleven times.

University of Massachusetts: UMass set new program records for wins in a season (21) and league wins (15) during the 2006-07 campaign ... Don "Toot" Cahoon, one of 13 NCAA DI coaches to take two different schools to the NCAA tournament, recorded his first NCAA win on Friday when the Minutemen bumped Clarkson in overtime, 1-0. Cahoon also took the 1997-98 Princeton Tigers to the NCAAs.

University of New Hampshire: Miami University denied Coach Richard Umile his 400th career win when the RedHawks edged the Wildcats, 2-1, in the opening round of the Northeast Regional ... Despite the loss, junior goaltender Kevin Regan (South Boston, MA) still leads the country in save percentage (.935) ... The Wildcats finished at 26-11-2, their 11th 20-plus win season ... UNH was one of four teams in the NCAAs that had made the tournament each of the last six seasons (Maine was going for the ninth straight time).
