BC EAGLES LAND THIRD NCAA TITLE IN SCHOOL HISTORY ~BC's Nathan Gerbe named Frozen Four's Most Outstanding Player~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. – The Boston College Eagles ended their season on Saturday night on a nine-game win streak with a 4-1 victory against Notre Dame in the NCAA Championship Game in front of a sellout crowd of 18,632 at the Pepsi Center in Denver, Colo. to capture its third NCAA title in school history. The Eagles win marked the fifth NCAA Championship for the league in its 24-year history, the first since 2001 when BC won the Frozen Four in Albany, N.Y.

Eagles' junior forward Nathan Gerbe (Oxford, Mich.) totaled eight points (5g,3a) in two games at the Frozen Four and was named the Most Outstanding Player of the 61st annual NCAA Championship for his efforts over the weekend. Gerbe finished the season as the nation's leading point and goal scorer with 68 points (35g,33a), as he scored 1.58 points per game, which also was the best mark in Division I college hockey. Gerbe was joined on the Frozen Four All-Tournament Team by sophomore forward Ben Smith (Avon, Conn.), senior captain Mike Brennan (Smithtown, N.Y.) and freshman goalie John Muse (East Falmouth, Mass.).

Gerbe recorded four points with a hat trick in the 6-1 win against North Dakota on Thursday afternoon and then he followed that up with another four-point effort (2g,2a) in the Championship Game. Muse, who played every minute this season for the Eagles, registered 49 saves in the Frozen Four, which included 29 stops vs. the Fighting Sioux and 20 saves in the victory against Notre Dame.

The Eagles finished the year at 25-11-8 and a 11-9-7 record in Hockey East play. BC also finishes the year with a No. 1 national ranking in the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Poll.

Head Coach Jerry York won his 803rd game of his collegiate career on Saturday night, as the active leading winningest coach in college hockey. York won his third NCAA title, which included his second with the Eagles program. He becomes the sixth NCAA head coach to win three national championships.

No. 2 seed Boston College won the Northeast Regional in Worcester, Mass. to advance to the Frozen Four, defeating Minnesota and Miami. The Eagles downed five nationally ranked teams en route to the NCAA title, which also included wins against New Hampshire for the schools eighth Hockey East Tournament title.

CAREER FIRSTS/MILESTONES/WHO'S HOT?

NATHAN GERBE, BC (OXFORD, MICH.)

It was Gerbe's seventh goal of the NCAA Tournament, tying him with three other players (the last being Boston University's Tony Amonte in 1990) for the most in a single tournament.

He was the first player to score five goals at the Frozen Four since Dave Silk of Boston University in 1977.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: The Eagles ended their season with a nine-game win streak, which begun on March 8 in the regular-season finale at Northeastern. They outscored their opponents, 42 to 14 in that time. BC recorded at least four goals in all of those games and posted five goals in five of those games...BC's offense finished the season ranked third in the nation at 3.64 goals per game...Freshman forward Joe Whitney (Reading, Mass.) recorded 51 points (11g,40a) in his freshman season for BC, he finished second in the nation among rookies with 1.16 points per game...Head Coach Jerry York's 16 appearances in the NCAA Tournament rank fourth all-time and his 29 tournament wins are most all-time, which includes 10 victories in Frozen Four contests. Coach York has taken his teams (BC and Bowling Green) to nine Frozen Fours in his coaching career.
