HOCKEY EAST STRONG OUT OF THE GATE WITH 8-2-1 RECORD

~League goes perfect against WCHA with 5-0 record; UVM takes RPI in Quebec City~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. – The league enjoyed a successful opening weekend with a 8-2-1 record in non-conference action, which included a perfect 5-0 record against the WCHA, headlined by the No. 9 ranked Boston University Terriers winning the Ice Breaker Tournament for the second time in school history. The Terriers defeated No. 5 North Dakota on Friday and a 2-1 win against No. 11 Michigan State in the Championship Game on Saturday. Sophomores Kevin Shattenkirk (New Rochelle, N.Y.), Nick Bonino (Unionville, Conn.) and Colin Wilson (Winnipeg, Man.) were each named to the Ice Breaker All-tournament Team, while Wilson earned Ice Breaker MVP honors.

Top ranked Boston College edged No. 14 Wisconsin, 5-4, on Friday at Conte Forum, after the Eagles raised their 2008 National Championship Banner. Senior Brock Bradford (Burnaby, B.C.) and sophomore Brian Gibbons (Braintree, Mass.) each registered three points apiece, while freshman forward Cam Atkinson (Greenwich, Conn.) scored the game-winner for the Eagles. On Saturday night, the No. 7 UNH Wildcats made quick work of the Badgers with a 5-1 season opening win at the Whittemore Center in Durham. Sophomore Danny Dries (Lake Orion, Mich.) recorded two assists in the game, while junior goalie Brian Foster (Pembroke, N.H.) stopped 30 of 31 shots by UW. The Wildcats were a perfect 10 for 10 on the penalty kill. Northeastern went 1-0-1 at the Kendall Hockey Classic, as it tied Alaska, 2-2, on Friday and skated to a 4-2 victory against host Alaska- Anchorage late Saturday night. Ryan Ginand posted two goals in the win for the Huskies on Saturday.

Vermont downed Rensselaer, 4-1, in its season opener at Quebec City on Saturday afternoon at the Pavillon de la Jeunesse. The Catamounts scored three goals in the final period, led by Justin Milo (Edina, Minn.), who posted two goals for UVM. Massachusetts came out of the Ice Breaker in Boston with a split: with a 3-1 loss to Michigan State on Friday and a huge 3-2 victory against WCHA foe North Dakota Saturday. Sophomore James Marcou (King Park, N.Y.) notched two goals, including the game-winner against the Fighting Sioux, while junior Dan Meyers (Voorhees, N.J.) tallied a career-high 40 saves against UND.

Merrimack also extended its non-league win streak to seven with a triumph over Robert Morris at Lawler Arena on Saturday. Sophomore forward Francois Ouimet (Lorraine, Que.) potted a pair of goals for the Warriors, while Andrew Braithwaite (Kingston, Ont.) made 23 saves. UMass-Lowell dropped a 2-1 decision at Colgate on Friday in Hamilton, N.Y. Sophomore Patrick Cey (Saskatoon, Sask.) scored the River Hawks' lone goal on Saturday. Maine went 1-0-1 against New Brunswick in a pair of exhibition games on the weekend.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Senior captain Brock Bradford (Burnaby, BC) registered three points (1g,2a) in his first game action since Jan. 19, 2008. Bradford's three-point performance marked his second three-point effort in season-opening games. The captain notched two goals and one assist in BC's 5-2 win over Northeastern in the 06-07 season opener on Oct. 10...Sophomore forward Brian Gibbons and junior forward Ben Smith (Avon, Conn) both extended their scoring streaks to eight games dating back to March 15, 2008 against Providence...Price registered two points (one goal and one assist), marking his third multiple-point performance of his 71-game collegiate career.

Boston University: Boston University is 2-0 to start a season for the first time since its 2001-02 campaign, when it opened with four consecutive wins...The Ice Breaker title marked was the Terriers' first in-season tournament championship other than the Beanpot since the 2002 Great Lakes Invitational. BU, which claimed the 2002 Ice Breaker title, became the third team to win the tournament twice, joining Hockey East mates Boston College and New Hampshire...BU allowed just one goal in both of its wins. Last season, the Terriers allowed two or more goals in 17 of their first 18 games...Three freshmen (Chris Connolly, Victor Saponari, David Warsofsky) recorded an assist on the weekend for their first career points...BU has won 10 of its last 11 games at Agganis Arena, including eight straight in regular-season action.

Maine: Maine played a pair of exhibition games at the University of New Brunswick this past weekend...The Black Bears won the first game 5-4, while the two teams skated to a 6-6 tie the following night...Maine scored three power play goals on Friday night...The Black Bears will now open the regular season by traveling 3,178 miles as the crow flies to Fairbanks, Alaska to compete in the Brice Alaska Goal Rush in Fairbanks...Maine plays Alaska Anchorage on Friday night and Alaska on Saturday night...Maine has 19 freshmen and sophomores on its roster. Only Ohio State, Robert Morris, UConn and Army have more freshmen and sophomore on its roster.

Massachusetts: With the win over No. 5 North Dakota, UMass defeated its highest ranked opponent since beating No. 4 Colorado College in the Tampa Lightning College Hockey Classic last December...UMass rebounded from an 0-for-6 power play night against Michigan State to convert 2-of-4 chances against North Dakota on Saturday. Conversely, UMass killed off a combined 6-of-8 power play chances for Michigan State and North Dakota...with the loss to Michigan State, UMass is now 36-38-2 all-time in season-opening games...Alex Berry had a career-high three assists against No. 5 North Dakota...James Marcou scored two goals against No. 5 North Dakota – his 12 career multi-point night...Topher Bevis (Sr., D, Harvard, Mass.) scored his first goal of the season against No. 5 North Dakota – his only goal last season was also scored in Agganis Arena against Boston University...With a goal and an assist on the weekend, captain Cory Quirk (Sr., F, Brockton, Mass.) moved into 20th all-time at UMass in career goals (33) and 21st all-time in career assists (42)...Head coach Don "Toot" Cahoon picked up his 114th win at UMass and his 294th overall. He needs just seven more to become the all-time winningest coach in UMass history and six more to reach 300.

UMass-Lowell: UMass Lowell is now 12-11-2 in 26 season openers as a Division I program after Saturday's 2-1 loss at Colgate...The River Hawks last two opening day losses (Saturday and Oct. 7, 2005) have come at Colgate...Saturday's loss was just the River Hawks' fourth in the last 16 games of allowing two goals or less (12-4-0)...David Vallorani recorded his first career point with an assist on Patrick Cey's second period goal...Fellow freshmen Michael Budd and Matt Ferreira also made their collegiate debuts Saturday...The River Hawks travel to Michigan State for a two-game series Thursday and Friday, the first meetings between the two programs since 2003-04.

Merrimack: Debuting their new yellow home jerseys, the Warriors' opening-night lineup featured seven freshmen and no seniors...Merrimack is 5-1-2 in its last eight home openers...They successfully killed off all nine Colonial power plays, including two two-man advantages of over 1:40...The Warriors are 7-0-1 in their last eight non-conference games, which includes a 6-0-1 record in 2007-08...The Warriors defeated Robert Morris for the first time in their history...Merrimack will play its next five games on the road.

New Hampshire: James van Riemsdyk (Middletown, N.J.) has scored in five-straight games dating back to last year's Hockey East quarterfinals... Has nine points (1g, 8a) in his last five games. The Wildcats have won eight-straight season openers. UNH has scored three or more goals in its last seven games...UNH won its eight-straight season opener and are 11-0-1 in its last 12 season openers. Under Umile, the 'Cats are 14-3-1 in season openers...Danny Dries recorded his seventh multiple point game of his career on Saturday vs. Wisconsin...The Wildcats have captured three straight over the Badgers and have outscored Wisconsin 21-12 in those three games. UNH is 6-1-0 in its last seven games against WCHA foes...All four of UNH's lines scored at least a goal in Saturday night's 5-1 win, which included two goals by the 'Cats third line.

Northeastern: The Huskies made their second appearance in the Kendall Hockey Classic, going 1-0-1, after going 0-2 in the Classic in 2001-02...Forward Ryan Ginand (2 GP, 2-1-3) and goalie Brad Thiessen (1-0-1, 1.92, .926) were named to the All-Tournament team...NU and Alaska Fairbanks both went 1-0-1 in the tournament, but UAF won by virtue of a shootout on Friday night...Senior Dennis McCauley scored goals on both Friday and Saturday and added an assist on Saturday...Northeastern opened the season 1-0-1 for the first time since 2002-03 when it tied Vermont and beat Connecticut.

Providence College: The Friars will open the season against Northeastern on October 17...Providence is 34-22-1 all-time in season openers and 12-10-2 in Hockey East openers...It will mark the second consecutive season that the Friars will open the league schedule against the Huskies...The 2008-09 PC roster will feature 22 veterans and eight freshmen.

Vermont: Vermont won the first-ever NCAA hockey game in Quebec City on Saturday with a 4-1 victory over Rensselaer. All proceeds from the game at the Pavillon de la Jeunesse went to cystic fibrosis...Former Catamount Martin St. Louis '97 of the Tampa Bay Lightning served as the honorary captain for Vermont while Joe Juneau, who graduated from RPI in 1991 and went on to spend 13 years in the NHL, served as the honorary captain for the Engineers...Members of the UVM and RPI coaching staffs as well as student-athletes from both teams held a hockey clinic for young Canadian players on Friday...The Catamounts are unbeaten in 39 straight games when scoring at least four goals...UVM is 3-3-0 in season openers under head coach Kevin Sneddon.
