WEEKEND PREVIEW #16

PROVIDENCE HOSTS NO. 11 BC ON NESN FRIDAY NIGHT AT SCHNEIDER ~No. 14 UNH meets No. 6 UVM; UMass faces off at Maine for two; Merrimack plays No. 2 BU and PC~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. – In a quiet weekend of league play, Hockey East teams will hit the ice for seven contests, including a Top-15 matchup between No. 6 Vermont and No. 14 New Hampshire Friday night. No. 11 Boston College at Providence will be broadcast on NESN on Friday, as well. No. 2 Boston University heads back to North Andover for a tilt at Merrimack, while No. 3 Northeastern travels to Amherst for a game at Massachusetts. Maine hosts a pair against UMass-Lowell and UMass, while Providence also welcomes Merrimack Saturday.

UVM and UNH head to the Whittemore Center on Friday, for their first tilt of the year. UNH is coming off a 3-1 loss to BU on Saturday at home, but hasn't lost back-to-back league games at home since Feb. 26 and March 5, 2005. Senior Jerry Pollastrone (Revere, Mass.) leads UNH in career scoring against the Catamounts, having tallied nine points (1g, 8a) over the past three seasons. Vermont is led by Viktor Stalberg (Gothenburg, Sweden) and Peter Lenes (Shelburne, Vt.) who have notched 25 and 24 points, respectively.

BC heads to Providence for a tilt against the Friars in this week's NESN game on Friday. Last season, PC owned the 2-0-1 advantage over the Eagles in regular season play, but BC swept the Friars in Hockey East Quarterfinal action. BC is coming off a weekend sweep of Maine at Conte, while PC looks to get back to its recent winning ways after dropping a pair to Northeastern.

UMass will host Northeastern on Friday at the Mullins Center. The Huskies have won five of their last six, behind backstop Brad Thiessen's (Aldergrove, B.C.) .939 save percentage and 1.90 GAA so far this year. UMass most recently tied Vermont at Gutterson on Saturday. Husky senior Ryan Ginand (Milford, Mass.) earned Reebok Player of the Week honors for his five-point weekend against Providence, including a hat trick on Friday night.

BU returns to North Andover for the second time in two weeks. On Jan. 16, BU emerged from Lawler Arena with a 4-1 victory over the Warriors. BU is enjoying a four-game win streak and is unbeaten in ten of its last 12. Rookie netminder Kieran Millan (Edmonton, Alb.) was named Pure Hockey Defensive Player of the Week, after allowing two or fewer goals in his last ten starts. J.C. Robitaille (Des Ruisseaux, Que.) scored the lone goal for the Warriors in the last contest against BU. The Terriers are allowing a league-best 1.92 goals per game, while MC ranks seventh with 2.55. The Warriors will then head to Providence to take on the Friars on Saturday. The Terriers (18 wins) need just one win to match their win total from all of last year (19).

Maine will host UMass-Lowell on Friday night before welcoming the Minutemen on Sunday. Black Bear rookie goaltender Scott Darling (Lemont, III.) has spent just shy of 1,073 minutes between the pipes this season, ranking fourth among Hockey East netminders. The River Hawks are coming off a weekend sweep of Merrimack and are led by sophomore Maury Edwards (Rocky Rapids, Alb.) 18 points this season. Sunday's matchup will feature two of the league's best offensive freshmen, in UMass' Casey Wellman (Brentwood, Calif.) and Gustav Nyquist (Malmo, Sweden). The two rank first and second in the league in rookie scoring, with 22 and 20 points, respectively.
