VERMONT OPENS REGIONAL PLAY FRIDAY NIGHT IN BRIDGEPORT ~Boston U., New Hampshire, Northeastern begin play Saturday~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. – Four Hockey East schools begin NCAA Regional play this weekend, beginning with No. 3 seed Vermont taking on No. 2 seed Yale in the East Regional in Bridgeport, Conn. on Friday. Saturday marks the start of the Northeast Regional in Manchester, N.H., where No. 1 overall seed Boston University is paired against No. 4 seed Ohio State and host school, No. 3 seed New Hampshire will play No. 2 seed North Dakota. Finally, in Grand Rapids' Midwest Regional, No. 2 seed Northeastern plays No. 3 seed Cornell Saturday afternoon.

Hockey East, which has been averaging 3.12 NCAA bids annually during its 25 year history, boasts four teams in the quest for the National Championship this year. The last HEA team to win the national title was last year's squad from Boston College.

BU makes its 16th appearance in the NCAA tournament since its induction into Hockey East, last qualifying for the tournament in 2007. The Terriers are 2-0 lifetime against The Ohio State University, most recently on December 27, 1998 in the Mariucci Classic. BU most recently earned its seventh Hockey East Tournament title after posting a 1-0 victory over UMass-Lowell in Saturday's championship game, while rookie netminder Kieran Millan (Edmonton, Alb.) earned the 32-save shutout en route to being named MVP of the tournament. BU looks to improve on its perfect 9-0-0 non-conference record earned this year, as it enters the national tournament. The Terriers are the 12th Hockey East team in league history to enter the NCAA Tournament with 30+ wins.

Hosting the Manchester regional, the Wildcats are making their 15th appearance in the NCAA tournament since 1985, their eighth consecutive berth. UNH faces a North Dakota team it has never before seen in the NCAA tournament, at 2pm on Saturday. The Wildcats have gone 3-10-2 against UND in program history, while senior Jerry Pollastrone (Revere, Mass.) leads UNH with two goals in four games against the Fighting Sioux. The teams last met on Dec. 29, 2007, when UNH skated away with a 7-4 victory. Wildcat James van Riemsdyk (Middletown, N.J.) is averaging 1.15 points per game, ranked 16th nationally, while netminder Brian Foster (Pembroke, N.H.) has amassed a 2.63 GAA in 33 games this season.

Vermont's bid to the East Regional at Bridgeport Arena at Harbor Yard marks the fourth trip to the NCAA tournament in school history, the first as a member of Hockey East. The Catamounts last played in the tournament in 1997, when they suffered a first-found loss to Denver. UVM takes on Yale Friday evening at 6:30 pm at the Bridgeport Arena at Harvard Yard. The Bulldogs own the slight 27-24-4 advantage in the all-time series between the schools, but the programs have never met in the NCAA tournament. The Catamounts look to improve on their 5-3-1 non-league mark, entering the tournament. UVM will look to junior Viktor Stålberg (Gothenburg, Sweden), the team leader in goals (23) and points (43), who ranks 13th in the nation with 1.19 points per game.

Northeastern heads west to Van Andel Arena in Grand Rapids, Mich. for its fourth ever NCAA Tournament appearance, the first since 1994. The Huskies will take on the Cornell Big Red on Saturday, a team they have only played five times in the 25-year history of Hockey East. The teams last met on Dec. 27, 2005, when Cornell skated away with a 3-0 victory during Bob Kullen/CCM Hockey East Coach of the Year Greg Cronin's first season behind the Northeastern bench. The Huskies will look for consistency from Reebok/Hockey East Player of the Year, Brad Thiessen (Aldergrove, B.C.). The NU netminder has earned a .932 save percentage and 2.09 GAA while playing every minute between the pipes for the Huskies.
