FIVE TEAMS SWEEP WEEKEND IN LEAGUE PLAY

~BU, UNH, NU and UVM all earn home ice for quarterfinal playoffs~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. – The second to last weekend of regular season play was full of sweeps and the league's top four teams captured home ice for the Hockey East quarterfinal round. No. 4 Northeastern swept UMass-Lowell in a home and home series, while No. 2 Boston University did the same to Massachusetts. No. 8 Vermont took four points from Maine in Orono, while No. 10 New Hampshire topped Merrimack at home and on the road. Rounding out the weekend, Boston College took a pair from Providence.

Northeastern held its place atop Hockey East with a pair of wins against UML, including a 3-0 shutout on Friday night. Brad Thiessen (Aldergrove, B.C.) recorded his third shut out of the season, in a 24-save performance on Friday while teammate and Pro Ambitions Rookie of the Week Mike McLaughlin (Seaforth, Ont.) tallied two points. Back in action at Tsongas Arena on Saturday, the Huskies pulled out a 3-1 victory behind David Strathman's (Tempe, Ariz.) two points. UML's David Vallorani (Hamilton, Ont.) netted the lone River Hawk goal on the weekend.

Things were looking bleak for BU on Friday night, falling to a 3-0 deficit before surging ahead and scoring six unanswered goals, coming away with a 6-3 win over UMass at the Mullins Center. Terrier co-captain Matt Gilroy (North Bellmore, N.Y.) earned four points on two goals and two assists, while classmate Jason Lawrence (Saugus, Mass.) registered a natural hat trick in the victory. The teams met again at Agganis Arena on Saturday night, when the Terrier offense again dominated, earning a 7-2 win. Seven Terriers garnered multiple points on the night, led by sophomore Nick Bonino's (Unionville, Conn.) three point effort. Lawrence added another two points on the night, earning him Reebok Player of the Week honors.

The Catamounts squeaked by the Black Bears with a pair of one-goal wins in Orono. First on Friday, Josh Burrows (Prairie Grove, Ill.) tallied two points en route to a 3-2 victory. Pure Hockey Defensive Player of the Week Rob Madore (Venetia, Pa.) stopped 30 shots in the win. Saturday's game seemed to be in a deadlock for the first two periods, before Maine opened scoring in the third. UVM netted both its goals in the final 6:09 of the game, including Justin Milo's (Edina, Minn.) game-winner, in the 2-1 decision.

UNH also came out victorious after two one-goal decisions, first topping Merrimack 4-3 on the road on Friday and then 1-0 at the Whittemore Center on Saturday. The Wildcats built up a 4-1 lead on Friday before Merrimack came back, skating to a 4-3 decision. Wildcat captain Greg Collins (Fairport, N.Y.) netted two goals, while Joe Cucci (Melrose Park, Ill.) tallied a pair of assists for the Warriors. Brian Foster (Pembroke, N.H.) earned his third shutout of the year on Saturday, in a 26-save showing. Peter LeBlanc (Hamilton, Ont.) netted the game's first and only goal 13:24 into the contest, proving to be the decision-maker.

BC fell behind Providence at the start of both games this weekend, before rallying to two victories. The Eagles earned a 5-1 victory on Friday at Conte Forum, behind rookie Barry Almeida's (Springfield, Mass.) three point, two goal night. Teammate Tim Filangieri (Islip Terrace, N.Y.) tallied two assists. At Schneider Arena on Saturday night, the Friars owned a three-goal lead through the first half of the game, before BC rallied to tie the game before the end of regulation. BC captain Brock Bradford (Burnaby, B.C.) netted two goals in the comeback, while classmate Benn Ferriero (Essex, Mass.) potted the overtime game-winner just 45 seconds into the extra frame.

THIS WEEK IN HOCKEY EAST HISTORY

March 3, 1990: Maine scored a school-record 16 goals against UMass Lowell. The Black Bears also set records for assists with 27 and points with 43 in the game.

March 4, 1988: Senior Jon Morris becomes only the second player in school history to score 50 points in all four years, scoring a goal as No. 4 seed ULowell and No. 5 seed BC skate to a 3-3 tie in the first game of their two-game, total-goals series in the first round of the Hockey East Tournament at the Tully Forum.

March 5, 2004: Northeastern goalie Keni Gibson set the NU single-season record with his fifth shutout in a 4-0 win over Massachusetts.

March 5-6, 1999: UNH sweeps a weekend series with Maine by a combined score of 10-2 to help UNH capture its first-ever outright Hockey East regular-season championship. The Wildcats need both wins to surpass Maine.

March 7, 1986: 7th-seeded UMass Lowell picks up its 300th victory all-time with a 4-2 win over Northeastern in the first round of the Hockey East Tournament.

TEAM NOTES

BOSTON COLLEGE: BC held Providence scoreless when it was on the power play, finishing 8-for-8 in penalty-killing situations. The team is 21-for-22 in penalty-killing situations over the last five games...BC scored one power-play goal in each victory over Providence and have scored a man-advantage goal in three straight games...Seniors Kyle Kucharski (Saugus, Mass.) and Andrew Orpik (East Amherst, N.Y.) have one point apiece in each of the last three games. Kucharski (2g, 1a) and Orpik (1g, 2a) have combined for six points...Senior Benn Ferriero (Essex, Mass.) played in his 159th and 160th career games, becoming the 15th player in BC history to play in 160 (or more) games...Senior Tim Filangieri (Islip Terrace, N.Y.) tallied two assists against Providence on Friday, marking his first multiple-assist effort of his career and the third multiple-point performance of his career...Brock Bradford ranks second among conference leaders (league games only) with 16 goals in 25 conference games...BC's 4-3 overtime victory at Providence marked sophomore goaltender John Muse's (East Falmouth, Mass.) 40th career win.

BOSTON UNIVERSITY: The Terriers have reached the 25-win mark during the regular season for the first time since the 1997-98 campaign, when they won 27 contests before entering the Hockey East tournament...BU is on a 14-game unbeaten streak (11-0-3), its longest since a 17-game stretch (14-0-3) during the 1995-96 season...Following Saturday's victory, BU has now won four games by a score of 7-2 this season...Senior Jason Lawrence scored nine goals in February, including four game-winners, to become just the second Terrier (Pete MacArthur; 21, 2007-08) since 2002 to score 20 goals in a single season...The Terriers rank first among Hockey East teams in scoring offense (3.88), scoring defense (1.97), power play (24.1 percent) and penalty kill (88.8 percent)...BU's penalty kill had been successful 24 straight times before UMass ended the streak in the closing minutes of Saturday's game...Freshman goaltender Kieran Millan (Edmonton, Alb.) is undefeated in his last 18 decisions (15-0-3)...BU has lost only three of the 10 games this season in which its opponent scored first.

MAINE: Maine senior Chris Hahn (Fort Qu'Appelle, Sask.) played in his 100th career game on Friday night. He joins teammates Matt Duffy (Windham, Maine) and Simon Danis-Pepin (Vaudreuil-Dorion, Que.) who have also played in 100 career games...Rookie Brian Flynn has currently scored at least one point in six straight games... Over that span he has three goals and four assists for seven points... Maine has lost 10 one-goal games this season, including the last four straight...Maine has scored 45.9 percent of its goals this season on the power play...Rookie Gustav Nyquist (Malmo, Sweden) continues to lead the team in scoring with 10 goals and 16 assists...The last freshman to lead the Black Bears in scoring was Paul Kariya during the 1992-93 season...Maine honored its four seniors Duffy, Hahn, Danis-Pepin and Jeff Marshall (Kyle, Sask.) on Saturday night.

MASSACHUSETTS: After a pair of losses to Boston University, UMass is 5-4-1 against teams ranked in the nation's top 5...Over the last six games, UMass is 7-for-32 (21.8%) on the power play...Against Boston University's power play, the UMass penalty kill struggled killing off just 10-of-16 chances (62.5%)...UMass has allowed just six first period goals in the last 16 games - UMass is 12-4-0 this season when leading after the first period...Only twice this season has Boston University trailed by 3 goals in a game - both were against UMass after the Minutemen took a 3-0 lead in Friday's game...BU's seven goals scored on Saturday were the most allowed this season by UMass.

UMASS-LOWELL: The River Hawks have killed 36 of the last 37 power plays against in the last seven games...UML was shutout for just the second time Friday night...The River Hawks have scored just two goals in the last three games (nine periods)...UML went 0-for-12 on the power play over the weekend and have gone three straight games without a power play goal for the first time this season...UMass Lowell was swept in a season series by Northeastern for the first time since 1994-95...Freshman David Vallorani has 23 points (8g, 15a) this season, the most points by a UML freshman since Jason Tejchma had 23 in 2003-04...The River Hawks drew 6,007 to its Saturday night game with Northeastern, the third time this season they have drawn over 6,000 fans. UML is averaging 4,341 fans per game this season.

MERRIMACK: The last six meetings between Merrimack and New Hampshire have been decided by one goal or less...Karl Stollery (Camrose, Alb.) continues to lead all freshmen in power play points with ten and all freshmen defensemen with 14 points in conference games. He is tied for third among all Hockey East defensemen in power play points...Jesse Todd (Camrose, Alb.) ranks second among all freshmen with 19 conference points...With a pair of one-goal losses to UNH over the weekend, Merrimack has lost 14 games by one-goal this season, setting a school record...Merrimack allowed just one power-play goal in February, killing off 36 of 37 short-handed situations. The Warriors' power play was 10-for-40 in February...With two games remaining, the Warriors are on pace to set a school record for fewest goals allowed in a season and in Hockey East for the second straight year. Merrimack gave up 93 goals in 2007-08, 82 in conference, and has allowed 81 overall this year, 71 in conference thus far...Merrimack has surrendered the second-fewest goals in the third period this year in Hockey East and has outscored its opponents 26-24 in the final frame...The Warriors' freshmen and sophomores have accounted for 67% of the team's points.

NEW HAMPSHIRE: UNH secured home ice for a league-best 13th-straight season. The Wildcats and Vermont will square off a pair of times next weekend in Burlington with third place on the line. UNH needs just two points out of the weekend to secure a third place finish, either way it will play host to either Mass-Lowell or Boston College. The last time UNH traveled for the quarterfinals was the 1995-96 season when the Wildcats lost two games to none at Maine. With a win over Merrimack on Friday night, UNH captured a win over every league foe for the second-straight season. UNH struggled on the road early going 0-5-2 in its first seven road games, since that time they are 5-1-1 in its last seven, including winning three straight. The Wildcats finished February 5-1-1 and are 12-1-2 in February over the past two seasons. UNH is 5-0-1 in its last six games and have scored the first goal of the game in all six.

NORTHEASTERN: Northeastern reached 22 wins for the second time in program history. The NU record for wins is 25 in 1981-82...North-eastern clinched home-ice in the Hockey East Quarterfinals for the first time since 1997-98...Northeastern swept the three-game season series with UMass Lowell for the first time since 1994-95. NU also swept Maine, Merrimack and Providence this season...Brad Thiessen became the first Northeastern goalie to win 22 games in a season with Saturday's 3-1 win over UMass Lowell. That broke Marc Robitaille's record of 21 from 1997-98. Friday's 3-0 shutout over the River Hawks was the ninth of Thiessen's career, extending his NU record. It was his third shutout of the season...Defenseman Jim Driscoll scored the second goal of his career in his 100th career game on Friday, his first since Dec. 30, 2006. He leads NU with a +15 rating.

PROVIDENCE COLLEGE: Freshman Matt Bergland has recorded one point in three of the last four games...Saturday night's loss against Boston College was the first time this season that the Friars have been defeated after leading after two periods...Junior co-captain John Cavanagh (Warwick, R.I.), who totaled six goals in his first two years, has a team best 10 goals this season...Senior Pierce Norton (South Boston, Mass.) has a career-high 13 assists this season...Senior Matt Taormina (Washington Township, Mich.), who has played in 139 career games, is tied for 26th all-time in the career games played list at Providence College...PC Head Coach Tim Army leads the all-time list with 151 games played...The Friars will close out their home schedule on Friday, March 6 against Boston University on Senior Night at Schneider Arena.

VERMONT: The Catamounts (19-8-5, 14-7-4 HEA) enter the week tied for fifth in the latest PairWise Ratings...Vermont's 19 wins are the most since 2004-05 when the Catamounts won 21 games in their final season in the ECAC...UVM's 14 Hockey East wins are a new program best...The Catamounts have swept three weekend series on the season...Vermont is 11-5 in one-goal games this year and 21-8 in one-goal games dating back to the start of last season...Freshman goalie Rob Madore ranks eighth in the national in goals against average (2.06) and second in Hockey East play (2.03)...The Catamounts are 16-2-3 when scoring at least three goals...Vermont finished the regular season 10-5-1 on the road...UVM is 6-4-2 against Maine since joining Hockey East...Vermont will honor its four seniors: Corey Carlson, Kyle Kuk, Peter Lenes and Dean Strong on "Senior Night" Saturday against New Hampshire.
