## BOSTON UNIVERSITY AND VERMONT ARE FROZEN FOUR BOUND

**~Catamounts and Terriers face off Thursday, April 9 in Washington, D.C.~**

**WAKEFIELD, Mass.** – Two Hockey East teams have earned Frozen Four berths after NCAA Regional play wrapped up this weekend. Boston University won the Northeast Regional in Manchester, N.H., while Vermont earned a trip to Washington D.C. after winning the East Regional in Bridgeport, Conn. It marks the 13th time that two or more Hockey East teams have advanced to the Frozen Four in the 25-year history of the league. It also marks the fifth time that Hockey East teams will meet in the semifinals of the Frozen Four.

BU defeated Ohio State 8-3 on Saturday night, as sophomore Nick Bonino (Unionville, Conn.) opened scoring in the first with a goal and later added two assists. Teammate Matt Gilroy (North Bellmore, N.Y.) led all skaters with four points, while Jason Lawrence (Saugus, Mass.) and Zach Cohen (Schaumburg, Ill.) each netted a pair of goals in the victory. In the other Northeast Regional Semifinal game, New Hampshire downed North Dakota in an exciting 6-5 overtime matchup. Peter LeBlanc (Hamilton, Ont.) netted his 14th goal of the year, 45 seconds into the extra frame, to send the Wildcats to the Northeast Regional final. Brian Foster (Pembroke, Mass.) made 40 saves for the 'Cats, while linemates Jerry Pollarstone (Revere, Mass.) and Mike Sislo (Superior, Wis.) each tallied a goal and two assists on the night. In Sunday's final, the Terriers earned a 2-1 victory over UNH on a late-game, power play goal by Lawrence, his eighth game-winner of the year. Lawrence was named the Northeast Regional Most Outstanding Player. The BU senior found the net with 15 seconds remaining in regulation, sending his team to the Frozen Four for the first time in 12 years. Rookie netminder Kieran Millan (Edmonton, Alb.) had 27 stops in the victory.

The Catamounts came out victorious from the East Regional after capturing a 4-1 decision over Yale on Friday night and winning a hard-fought, double overtime battle 3-2 against Air Force on Saturday. In the Yale game, UVM was a perfect seven-for-seven on the penalty kill, as rookie Rob Madore (Venetia, Pa.) made 25 stops on the night. Viktor Stålberg (Gothenburg, Sweden) netted the game-winner in the second, while seven other Catamounts got on the scoring sheet. Back in action on Saturday, it was Madore's 46-save performance and a goal at 14:10 in the second overtime by sophomore Dan Lawson (Oak Forest, Ill.) that lifted Vermont to victory and earned the Catamounts their second trip to the Frozen Four in program history. Lawson was named the Most Outstanding Player of the East Regional for his efforts.

Northeastern lost a heartbreaker to Cornell in the first round of the Midwest Regional in Grand Rapids, Mich. The Huskies fell 3-2 to the Big Red, despite a 29-save performance by Brad Thiessen (Aldergrove, B.C.) and goals by Steve Silva (Tyngsboro, Mass.) and Louis Liotti (Westbury, N.Y.).

## TEAM NOTES

**BOSTON UNIVERSITY:** The Terriers enter the Frozen Four with a record of 33-6-4, one win shy of the school record of 34 set in the 1993-94 season...BU now has four players with 40 points or more this season, marking the first time that feat has been achieved since the 1995-96 squad had six 40-point scorers...Head coach Jack Parker has extended his record number of NCAA semifinal appearances to 13...Millan broke the school record for wins by a goaltender in a single season and now has 27. He is 14-0-1 in his 16 starts away from Agganis Arena this season...BU is making its first appearance at the "Frozen Four", as the 1999 tournament was the first to have that name...Dating back to Feb. 8 of last season, BU is 44-9-4 in its last 57 games...In the national semifinals, the Terriers will be facing the only team that has a winning record against them this season in Vermont...Led by sophomore Nick Bonino at a nation-best plus-28, BU boasts five of the nation's top 12 players in plus/minus this season... This year's six-member senior class enters their first Frozen Four appearance with a record of 98-43-21 (.864) over the past four seasons...The Terriers have scored exactly twice as many goals as their opponents this season (168-84).

**NORTHEASTERN:** Northeastern finished the season at 25-12-4, tying the program record for wins and finishing with more than twice as many wins as losses for the first time since 1981-82, when NU went 25-9-2... NU advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1994, losing to Cornell, 3-2, in the first round. Northeastern was one of six teams upset by a lower seed in the first round of the NCAA Tournament...NU gave up goals in the final minute of regulation in each of its last three games this season...Goaltender Brad Thiessen (Aldergrove, B.C.) set Northeastern single-season records for wins (25), goals against average (2.12), save percentage (.931), saves (1195), games (41) and minutes (2495:44)...Steve Silva (Tyngsboro, Mass.) scored in the loss to Cornell, giving him a 4-16-20 scoring line for the season. He became NU's seventh skater with over 20 points, the first time NU has had seven players over 20 points since 1998-99. The last time Northeastern had more than seven 20-point scorers was 1994-95.

**NEW HAMPSHIRE:** Sunday's regional final was third all time meeting between BU and UNH in the NCAA Regional final. Ironically, both previous games were played on March 29 as well... Brian Foster stopped a season high 40 shots in a 6-5 win over North Dakota. His career high was a 41 save performance Nov. 19, 2007 at Providence... With a win on Saturday, the Wildcats advanced to the regional final for the first time since 2005... Peter LeBlanc added to his team leading game-winning goals total with his fourth of the

season on an overtime tally against North Dakota... A total of 10 ECats recorded at least one point Saturday vs. North Dakota, and it marked the first point in NCAA tourney play for eight of them; seniors Greg Collins (goal, assist), Jamie Fritsch (assist), Thomas Fortney (goal) and Kevin Kapstad (assist)... James van Riemsdyk registered his 40th point Saturday and it marks the 20th-straight season UNH has had a player with at least 40 points. The last time the Wildcats did not have a 40-point scorer was the 1988-89 season... With Saturday's 6-5 overtime win vs. North Dakota here in the Northeast Regional, UNH head coach Dick Umile has guided the Wildcats to 20+ wins in 13 straight seasons. It is coach Umile's 18th 20-win season in just 19 years of coaching at UNH. Only Michigan has a longer streak of 20-win seasons.

**VERMONT:** The Catamounts (22-11-5, 15-8-4 HEA) defeated Yale 4-1 and Air Force 3-2 in double overtime at the East Regional at Bridgeport Arena at Harbor Yard in Bridgeport, Conn., to advance to the 2009 Frozen Four...It marks the second-ever Frozen Four appearance for Vermont, who last advanced to the Frozen Four in 1996... Saturday's double overtime win against Air Force went 94:10 and was the longest game in program history...Previously Vermont's 4-3 double overtime loss to Colorado College in the 1996 Frozen Four was the longest game in school history...Sophomore defenseman Dan Lawson (Oak Forest, Ill.) scored two goals, including the game winner with 5:50 left in double overtime in Saturday's win on his way to being named the East Regional Most Outstanding Player...Junior Viktor Stålberg (Gothenburg, Sweden) was named to the East Regional All-Tournament Team after recording a goal and an assist on the weekend. The Hobey Baker Award finalist has recorded at least one point in 25 of the last 28 games...Freshman goalie Rob Madore (Venetia, Pa.) stopped 70 of 73 shots (.959 save percentage) on the weekend...The Catamounts are 3-4 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.

**HOCKEY EAST FROZEN FOUR NOTES:** Boston U. and Vermont earning trips to the Frozen Four marks the 13th time that two or more Hockey East teams have qualified for the Frozen Four in the 25-year history of the league... Over the last 12 seasons, 20 of the 48 Frozen Fours qualifiers have come from Hockey East...Since 1993, the league has boasted 15 of the 30 teams that have advanced to the National Championship Game and this year that number will increase to 16 with BU and Vermont playing each other...Hockey East teams have won five national titles in 1993 (Maine), 1995 (Boston U.), 1999 (Maine), 2001 (BC) and 2008 (BC)...Hockey East teams own a 18-15 record in Frozen Four semifinal play.
