## BU AND UMASS CLASH ON ESPNU; BOSTON COLLEGE COMPETES IN DENVER CUP ~Holiday Touraments in full swing; UNH hosts Cornell on ESPNU Sunday~

**WAKEFIELD, Mass.** – No. 5 ranked Boston College will kickoff the holiday schedule at the Denver Cup at Magness Arena on Friday night, opening with ECAC foe St. Lawrence, while Boston University and Massachusetts will play the only league game of the weekend on Saturday at Agganis Arena (4pm) live on FSPNII

The Eagles are a perfect 3-0-0 in non-league play this season heading into the Denver Cup. BC has won its last five games by a combined score of 19 to 10. Sophomore forward Cam Atkinson (Greenwich, Conn.) notched five points (4g,1a) in the month of December for the Eagles in four contests. The Eagles will face host No. 2 Denver on Saturday night in the tournament finale.

BU and UMass are even in their last 10 meetings at 4-4-2, including UMass' 3-2 victory vs. the Terriers at the Mullins Center on Oct. 16. UMass is outscoring opponents 25-to-13 in the third period this season, including three 3-goal third periods. Junior forward James Marcou (Kings Park, N.Y.) leads the nation with 1.76 points per game for the Minutemen. He is also the leading active scorer in Hockey East with 109 career points and 76 points in league play.

Merrimack College will compete in the Badger Classic beginning on Saturday night at the Kohl Center, while UMass-Lowell and Northeastern skate at the Dartmouth Tournament. The Warriors will face host No. 7 Wisconsin in the tournament opener on Saturday night. Merrimack owns a 3-2-0 record this season and have scored 17 goals in those five games. Freshman forward Stephane Da Costa (Paris, France) in the only Hockey East rookie to led their team in scoring this year with 19 points (9g,10a).

Northeastern will face host Dartmouth on Saturday at 7pm, while the River Hawks will faceoff against Holy Cross in the 4pm game. UML is 5-2-0 in non-conference games this season and return to action after a 21-day break since its weekend split vs. Princeton on Dec. 11 and 12.

New Hampshire and No. 4 Cornell will square off on ESPNU Sunday from the Whittemore Center in Durham. The Wildcats are currently in the midst of a league-high seven game unbeaten streak (6-0-1) heading into Sunday's contest with the Big Red. UNH has won four of the last six meetings against Cornell, which included two NCAA Tournament games in 2002 and 2003.

Vermont will host the annual Catamount Cup at Gutterson Fieldhouse in Burlington, Vt. The 'Cats will face Alabama-Huntsville in the tournament opener on Saturday. The Catamounts have won two straight non-conference games headed into their own tournament this weekend. UVM has scored 3+ goals in 10 of 16 games this season. Sophomore goalie Rob Madore (Pittsburgh, Pa.) notched a solid month in December with a 2-0-1 record (1.96 GAA, .933 save percentage) for Vermont.

Maine will play a single exhibition game on Saturday night at Alfond Arena vs. New Brunswick, after they were crowned of the Florida College Classic on Wednesday night with a huge 3-2 win over No. 4 Colorado College. Sophomore forward Gustav Nyquist (Malmo, Sweden) ranks second in the nation in scoring at 1.58 points per game for the Black Bears.
