BOSTON UNIVERSITY AND PROVIDENCE COLLEGE MEET ON NESN FRIDAY NIGHT ~UMass and UMass-Lowell skate in intrastate series: Northeastern travels north to Vermont~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. - Boston University and Providence College will faceoff live on NESN Friday night from Schneider Arena, while Massachusetts and UMass-Lowell begin a two-game set beginning on Friday at the Mullins Center in Amherst. The Vermont Catamounts entertain Northeastern for a pair of games at Gutterson Fieldhouse starting on Friday. Maine heads south for the weekend to play at Boston College and Providence on Saturday night.

The Terriers are coming off a huge 3-2 win against arch rival Boston College at Fenway Park last Friday night, while the Friars will return to action after 4-1 loss to the Eagles on Tuesday night at Conte Forum, ending their month-long break from game play. The Terriers won the season series last year, 2-1, which included victories the final two meetings by a combined 11-2 score. Junior forward Nick Bonino (Unionville, Conn.) has potted five goals in his last seven games, after starting the season with a six-game scoreless streak. PC sophomore netminder Alex Beaudry (Cumberland, Ont.) ranks second in the conference with a .921 save percentage. Beaudry notched 41 saves in the losing effort Tuesday night vs. BC. BU and Merrimack will also meet on Saturday night at Agganis Arena. The Warriors penalty kill at 83.5% ranks second among Hockey East teams. Merrimack owns a 7-0-0 record this season when leading after two periods of play.

Sophomore forward David Vallorani (Hamilton, Ont.) led the way for the River Hawks in the 5-3 win vs. UMass at Tsongas Arena on December 5 in their first meeting of the year, posting his first collegiate hat trick. The Minutemen and River Hawks are coming wins vs. Northeastern at Matthews Arena. UML's Michael Scheu (Buffalo, N.Y.) scored the overtime game-winner with 26 seconds remaining in the 6-5 win, while UMass was victorious on Sunday night by a 4-1 score.

Maine heads into the weekend on a nine-game (7-0-2) unbeaten streak, the longest current active streak in the nation among Div. I programs. The Black Bears have received strong play during the streak from sophomore Scott Darling (Lemont, III.) who has registered a 1.83 GAA and a .928 save percentage in Maine's last nine games. The Eagles rank second in the league in team offense (3.47) and team defense (2.74). Freshman Parker Milner (Pittsburgh, Pa.) made his sixth career start on Tuesday, making 15 saves for his fifth victory of the season.

Vermont won the first meeting of the season series with Northeastern back on November 27, 3-2. at Matthews Arena. Sophomore goalie Rob Madore (Pittsburgh, Pa.) tallied 28 saves in the Catamount victory. He is 3-0-1 with a 1.97 goals against average and a .931 save percentage in his last five appearances. UVM owns a 9-3-4 record vs. the Huskies since joining the league in the fall of 2005. In the third period this season, the Huskies and PC have allowed a league-low 14 goals on the year. The Huskies own a 6-1-1 record this year when they score the first goal of the game.

New Hampshire and Dartmouth will square off in the Battle for the RiverStone Cup IX at the Verizon Wireless Arena in Manchester, N.H. on Saturday night. UNH holds a 5-2-1 advantage in eight previous meetings in the Battle for the RiverStone Cup. Senior Bobby Butler has 97 career points (47g, 50a) and is looking to become the 67th member of the 100-point club in school history.
