### **VERMONT HOSTS MAINE FOR TWO; UNH AND MERRIMACK PLAY HOME-AND-HOME SET** ~UMass squares off vs. BU and PC: UML and NU skate Friday: BC hosts Friars at Conte Forum~

WAKEFIELD, Mass. - Maine will travel to Burlington for a two-game set vs. the Vermont Catamounts beginning on Friday night at Gutterson Fieldhouse, while Merrimack and No. 12 UNH take the ice for a home-and-home series starting Friday at Lawler Arena. Providence College will play a pair of games on the weekend traveling to No. 15 Boston College on Friday and hosting No. 14 Massachusetts on Saturday.

Maine was victorious in the first meeting of the season series with the Catamounts by a 4-1 score at Alfond Arena back on Oct. 30. The Catamounts are coming off a split with the Minutemen last weekend, while the Black Bears scored four goals in a pair home exhibition victories last week. Sophomore forward Gustav Nyquist (Malmo, Sweden) is currently third in the nation with 1.45 points per game for the Black Bears and his 32 points overall (13g, 19a) is the ninth best total in the country. Vermont sophomore goalie Rob Madore (Pittsburgh, Pa.) has been outstanding over his last three starts, owning a 1.40 GAA and a .953 save percentage with two victories.

The Warriors and Wildcats will finish their league season series over the weekend after a 5-4 UNH win on Nov. 28 in North Andover, Mass. The 'Cats bring an 11-game (9-0-2) league unbeaten streak into the game on Friday night. Senior forward Bobby Butler (Marlboro, Mass.) is the active leading Wildcat scorer against Merrimack with eight points (4g,4a) in 10 career contests. Merrimack is coming off of a 2-1 overtime win vs. Providence College last Saturday night courtesy of Brandon Brodhag's (Brooklyn Park, Minn.) game-winner just 1:03 into the extra frame. Senior Chris Barton has a point in five of his last seven games with eight points (5g,3a) during that stretch.

The Eagles were victorious in their first two meetings vs. PC this season by scores of 3-1 (Dec. 12) and (Jan. 12) 4-1. Four of the last five games that the Friars have skated in have been one goal games. which includes two over time losses. Junior forward Brian Gibbons (Braintree, Mass.) leads the BC roster in scoring with 26 points (9g,17a) in his junior season. PC netminder Alex Beaudry (Cumberland, Ont.) has averaged 35.2 saves in his last six starts, which included three performances of 39+ saves.

UMass and Boston University will meet on Friday night at Agganis Arena for the second time this season, after the Terriers dominated the game in Boston on Jan. 2 by a 7-3 score. The Minutemen won the first meeting of the year back on Oct. 16 in Amherst (3-2). Junior forward James Marcou (Kings Park, N.Y.) continues to lead the nation in scoring with 1.62 points per game for the Minutemen and his 39 points is best among league skaters.

The Huskies and River Hawks will also get re-acquainted on Friday night at Matthews Arena. The two teams have already met three times this year since the schools met an additional game in the Dartmouth Holiday Tournament. UMass-Lowell has won two games this year vs. the Huskies, which included the last meeting in overtime (6-5) on Jan. 9 in Boston. In league play, UML's scoring defense is best, allowing only 2.53 goals per contest.

UMass and Providence will also meet on Saturday night at Schneider for the final time this season, after the schools split the first two games earlier in the year.
