GARDEN FIELD SET FOR 26TH ANNUAL HOCKEY EAST CHAMPIONSHIPS ~No. 2 BC faces No. 8 Vermont at 5pm; No. 3 BU skates with No. 4 Maine at 8pm~

Wakefield, Mass. - In the first weekend of 2010 Hockey East Tournament action, the games proved to be an exciting beginning to the second season, launching Hockey East fans into the playoff atmosphere around New England on the Road to the Garden. No. 8 Vermont upset the regular-season champion and top seeded UNH in an overtime thriller on Sunday, while No. 4 Maine knocked off No. 5 UMass-Lowell in overtime in the decisive third game. No. 2 Boston College defeated No. 7 UMass in two games, while No. 3 BU edged No. 6 Merrimack in a three game set.

The Minutemen outshot BC 38-32 in Game 1 and owned a 14-7 advantage in the final frame, but their fierce two-goal comeback in the third period fell short. BC's Cam Atkinson (Greenwich, BC) recorded his second career hat trick in the game with a four-point effort, while teammate Joe Whitney (Reading, Mass.) registered his 100th career point. Freshman goaltender Parker Milner made 33 stops in the win. The Eagles cruised to sweep the series with a 5-2 victory on Saturday night at Conte Forum to advance to the Garden for the sixth consecutive season. Barry Almeida (Springfield, Mass.) scored a game-high three points (2g,1a).

Merrimack made their first tournament appearance since the 2004 season this weekend skating fiercely with the defending tournament champion Terriers for three games. BU took a 1-0 lead in the series with a 3-2 win Friday night. On Saturday, Merrimack earned their first victory in Agganis Arena in the last 11 tries with an exciting 3-2 overtime victory. Merrimack rookies Stephane Da Costa (Paris, France) and Brandon Brodhag (Brooklyn Park, Minn.) scored the first two goals for the Warriors but it was junior Joe Cucci's overtime game-winner that counted most. In Sunday's tilt the Terriers took control and skated past the Warriors in a quick 3-0 victory. Kieran Millan (Edmonton, Alb.) stopped all 36 shots in the Sunday's shutout effort.

UNH scored five unanswered goals to blast past the eighth ranked Catamounts in a 7-4 win in Game one of the quarterfinal series. Saturday night was a different story at the Whittemore Center as both teams struggled to get on the board. Vermont pulled out a shutout win scoring the lone goal from rookie David Pacan (Ottawa, Ont.). Defensive Player of the week Rob Madore (Pittsburgh, Pa.) rebounded from the previous night stopping all 17 shots he faced in the contest. In Sunday's overtime thriller, senior forward Jay Anctil (Wolfeboro, N.H.) stunned the top ranked Wildcats and netted the overtime game-winner. Brian Foster (Pembroke, N.H.) recorded 50 saves in his finale at the Whittemore Center. Rob Madore stopped UNH's 34 shots and earned his second shutout in as many nights.

Maine will travel south to Boston for the weekend after an overtime victory lifted them past UML in the best of three series. Jeremy Dehner (Madison, WI) and Ben Holmsrom (Colorado Springs, Col.) scored for the River Hawks in the win Friday. The Black Bears returned on Saturday determined to win and shutout UML by a score of 2-0. Spencer Abbott (Hamilton, Ont.) and Tanner House (Cochrane, Alb.) each registered a goal apiece in the winning effort. Senior goalie Dave Wilson (Caledon East, Ont.) earned his first shutout of the season stopping all 23 shots that came his way. On Sunday, Maine edged out an overtime 3-2 victory. Player of the Week Will O'Neill (Salem, Mass.) took control of the game with his three-point performance, which including two goals for the Black Bears. Tanner House popped a quick one at 5:10 into the overtime period to lift the Black Bears past UML by a score of 3-2.

CAREER FIRSTS/MILESTONES/WHO'S HOT?

CAM ATKINSON, BC (GREENWICH, CONN.)

Tallied a career-high four points (3g,1a) in Friday's 6-5 win, tallied his second career hat trick, matching his three-goal effort in a 7-0 home win over Merrimack (Feb. 23)

JUSTIN BRAUN, UMASS (VADNAIS HEIGHTS, MINN.)

Tied the UMass games played record (150 games) set by Cory Quirk in 2008-09. Braun finished his career with 23 goals, 65 assists and a +12 rating

BRIAN FOSTER, UNH (PEMBROKE, N.H.)

Stopped a career-high 50 shots on Sunday night and also became just the four player in UNH history to stop 1,000 shots in a single season

TANNER HOUSE, MAINE (COCHRANE, ALB.)

Played in his 100th career game on Saturday, March 13

CHRIS KREIDER, BC (BOXFORD, MASS.)

Scored once in Friday's 6-5 win over Massachusetts and has scored once in nine of the last 13 games

JAMES MARCOU, UMASS (KINGS PARK, N.Y.)

Finished the year with 11 goals and a UMass single-season record 40 assists. His 51 points ranks 4th all-time at UMass for a single-season and is the program's Modern Era Division I record. His 96 career assists is the program's all-time career record

MARK NEMEC, MAINE (ROUSES POINT, N.Y.)

Scored his first career goal in Maine's 2-1 loss to UMass Lowell on Friday night

ADAM ROSS, MC (RED DEER, ALB.)

Played in his 100th game on Friday at Boston U.

UNH WILDCATS AT HOME

have won 10 games at home for the 15th-straight season

JOSH VAN DYK, MAINE (WOODSTOCK, ONT.)

Played in his 100th career game on Friday, March 12

CASEY WELLMAN, UMASS (BRENTWOOD, CALIF.)

Finished the year with 23 goals and 22 assists. His 45 points is the 11th-best single-season effort in UMass history, while his 11 power play goals is a new school record for a season. His 23 goals are tied for 6th-best in a single season and he is the first player since Greg Mauldin (2002-03) to score 20-or-more goals in a season.

JOE WHITNEY, BC (READING, MASS.)

Tallied three assists and his 100th collegiate point in the team's 6-5 win over the Minutemen on Friday with an assist on younger brother Steven Whitney's decisive goal, joining teammates Ben Smith and Brian Gibbons as BC's active 100-point scorers

TEAM NOTES

BOSTON COLLEGE: BC advanced to its sixth straight league tournament semifinal and its 12th under Jerry York...With two wins, BC improved to 49-23-2 (.676 win percentage) in 26 Hockey East Tournament appearances, including a 40-11-1 record (.779 win percentage) under Jerry York...BC concluded its 2009-10 season with a 14-2-0 record in Kelley Rink, tying the 1999-2000 team (14-2-1) and the 2003-04 team (14-3-1) for most home wins in a season under York. Fourteen wins is the second-highest win total in Kelley Rink's 22-year history. The 1989-90 team, led by captain Greg Brown, won a single-season best 18 home games (18-5-0)...BC's senior class – Matt Lombardi, Carl Sneep (Nisswa, Minn.), Ben Smith (Avon, Conn.) and captain Matt Price (Milton, Ont.) improved its record in the month of March to 21-3-1 and its postseason record to 19-2-0...Barry Almeida matched his career high with three points (2g, 1a) and was a game-high +4 in the team's 5-2 series-clinching win over Massachusetts. Lombardi's game-winning goal in Saturday's 5-2 win marked the first decisive score of his 139-game career. He is the 14th BC player to registered at least one of BC's 23 game-winning goals...Junior goaltender John Muse (East Falmouth, Mass.) recorded 16 saves in earning the series-clinching victory to improve his career postseason numbers to 11-1 with a 1.63 GAA and a .944 save percentage.

BOSTON UNIVERSITY: For the fourth straight year, Boston University had its Hockey East quarterfinal series go three games and, once again, came out on top in the decisive game to reach the semifinal round for a record ninth consecutive season...The Terriers avoided having their season come to an end at home, which hasn't happened since 1988...BU's 3-2 setback game two against Merrimack was its first overtime loss in over two years. The Terriers had last lost in overtime back on Feb. 4, 2008, against Boston College and were 6-0-7 in extra time since then...Senior Luke Popko (Skillman, N.J.) has played in 16 Hockey East tournament games, one away from the school record...More than half (19) of the Terriers' 36 games this season have been decided by a single goal and they have gone 11-8 in those contests...BU went nine straight games without holding a lead after two periods - the longest such streak in at least 11 years - before entering the third period of Sunday's contest with a 2-0 lead...Each of Kieran Millan's last two shutouts have come in the Hockey East tournament...Merrimack entered the quarterfinals with the third-best power play in the nation, but the Terrier penalty kill was successful on 17 of 18 occasions over the weekend.

MAINE: Maine returns to the Hockey East semifinals for the first time since the 2006 season...Captain Tanner House scored the game-winning goal 5:10 into overtime on Sunday night against UMass Lowell... It is the first time that Maine has won a game in overtime since defeating UMass in overtime on March 8, 2008... Senior goalie Dave Wilson picked up his second career shutout when he defeated UMass Lowell 2-0 on Saturday night... It was also Wilson's first win of the season... It was Maine's first shutout since defeating UNH 1-0 on Feb. 7, 2009. Wilson picked up his second victory of the season on Sunday night...Sophomore defenseman Will O'Neill has a had in all three of Maine's goal in the game-clinching win over UMass Lowell on Sunday night...Maine finished with 12 wins at home this season, the most since the 2005-06 season when Maine had 15...Gustav Nyquist (Malmo, Sweden) has 41 assists on the season, one shy of moving into ninth place on the single season assists list at Maine... Nyquist has 59 points on the season, the most since Steve Kariya finished with 65 points during the 1998-99 season.

MASSACHUSETTS: UMass finished the 2009-10 season with an 18-18-0 overall record after starting the season with an 11-5-0 record...UMass lost six of its final eight games including both Hockey East Quarterfinal games at Boston College...UMass is now 9-22 all-time in the Hockey East Playoffs...UMass was 6-6 during the regular-season against the Hockey East Final Four (BU, BC, ME, UVM)... This was the 8th consecutive year that UMass had qualified for the Hockey East Tournament and the 13th time overall since joining the league in 1994-95...UMass finished the year going 5-for-19 on the power play (26.3%) in the last four games after going 4-for-46 (8.7%) in the previous 10 games...UMass ranked as high as No. 10 nationally in late November having one of the top offenses and power play units in college hockey, but fell on tough times in the second half of the season – particularly February (0-6)...UMass posted the 11th-best attendance in college hockey during the regular-season with a school-record average 5,313 fans per home game.

UMASS-LOWELL: The River Hawks (19-16-4, 12-11-4 HE) fell in a hard fought battle with Maine in the Hockey East Tournament quarterfinals this weekend...UMass Lowell finishes with an above .500 record in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2000-2002...Carter Hutton (Thunder Bay, Ont.) was outstanding in the three-game series, stopping 79-of-85 shots (.929) and holding the Black Bear power play to two goals in 18 chances (11.1%)...In Friday's 2-1 victory, Hutton stopped 17-of-18 shots to earn his 13th win of the season...Jeremy Dehner (Madison, Wis.) and Ben Holmstrom (Colorado Springs, Col.) each netted goals...UMass Lowell was shutout for the first time on the campaign during Saturday's 2-0 loss...Hutton made 28 saves and held the Black Bear power play to one goal in eight chances...In the 3-2 overtime loss in game three, Hutton was masterful with 33 saves...The River Hawks led twice in the contest as freshman Colin Wright (Burlington, Ont.) and junior Scott Campbell (Navan, Ont.) each scored goals in the loss.

MERRIMACK: Merrimack's season come to an end on Sunday, losing to third-seed Boston University in three games...The Warriors finish the season with a school-record 16 wins, 12 conference wins, and 12 home wins...They picked up their first postseason victory in 14 games, since defeating BU in the 1998 quarterfinals...The 3-2 overtime win was the first game decided in the 91-game history of Merrimack and BU in the extra frame...It was Merrimack's first-ever OT playoff victory...The Saturday win, the first under head coach Mark Dennehy in the playoffs, was also the Warriors' first-ever win at Agganis Arena in 11 tries and the first at BU since March 2, 2001...In game one, senior Pat Kimball (Framingham, Mass.) scored his first goal of the season and his first since February 6, 2009...All of Merrimack's six seniors were in uniform in game two and three. These seniors won just three games as freshmen, scoring 37 goals in 34 games. They were in the playoff race until the final weekend as sophomores, before losing 14 one-goal games as juniors. As seniors, they were part of the Merrimack class that returned to the playoffs for the first time since 2004...Merrimack also beat every Hockey East team at home and overall for the first time ever and was not swept in any weekend series by a Hockey East opponent for the first time in school history...Merrimack finished sixth in Hockey East in scoring, averaging 3.06 goals per game. It is the first time since 2002 they did not finish last in scoring and the first time since 1998 that they did not finish in the bottom two in the conference.

NEW HAMPSHIRE: Bobby Butler became the nation's leading goal scorer with 27 goals on the season... Bobby Butler is just the UNH sixth player since 2000 to register 50 points in a single season and the first since Sean Collins and Preston Callander did so in 2004-05... Bobby Butler becomes the first UNH player to score 25 goals in a season since Preston Callander did so in 2004-05, while Steve Saviano had 27 goals in 2003-04... Brian Foster stopped 105 shots in three games in the Wildcats three-game series with Vermont. The senior stopped a career-high 50 shots on Sunday night. He posted a 1.85 GAA, .946 save percentage. Foster averaged 35 saves per game over the weekend and allowed just two goals in the final 116:20 of the weekend... On Friday night, the Wildcats matched a season-high with seven goals against Vermont... With a win at home on Friday night, the Wildcats have won 10 or more games at home every year since 1996-97... Nick Krates (Palos Park, Ill.) has scored two of his three career goals this season against Vermont... New Hampshire is now 17-13-7 overall and awaits the NCAA Selection Show on Sunday, March 21 (11:30 a.m.) on ESPN2 for the announcement of the tournament field. The Wildcats are hoping to extend the nation's second-longest active NCAA streak to nine-straight appearances.

VERMONT: The Catamounts have earned a spot in the Hockey East Semifinals for the second time in program history...Vermont defeated BU in the semifinals, 3-1, in 2008 before losing to eventual national champion Boston College in the championship game...Vermont is the fourth No. 8 seed in the 26-year history of Hockey East to advance past the quarterfinals...The No. 8 seed has never advanced past the semifinals...The last No. 8 seed to knock off the No. 1 seed was Boston University when they upset Boston College in 2004...Sophomore Rob Madore played 135 minutes and 52 seconds of shutout hockey in the final two games of the series against UNH – each 1-0 wins for Vermont. That was after allowing six goals on 21 shots in a 7-4 loss in Game 1...Vermont has six shutouts as a team on the season to rank tied for third most in the country...Madore has four shutouts this season and five in his career...The Catamounts became the first team in the 86-year history of the UNH program to shut out the Wildcats in their own building in back-to-back games...Prior to Game 2 of the series Vermont had never shut out New Hampshire in 90 all-time meetings...The Catamounts went 2-1 against Boston College, their opponent in the Hockey East Semifinals, in the regular season.

For the third time in the 26-year history of the Hockey East Tournament, we welcome the #2, #3, #4, and #8 seeds to the championship round. If history means anything here, we are in for a special final. Back in 1991, in the second year of the brief "Hockeyfest" event (combined ECAC and Hockey East tournaments), #3 Boston University met #2 Maine in the championship game, the schools having vanquished #4 Providence and #8 Northeastern, respectively. The final concluded with an overtime goal by BU's Shawn McEachern, now a Lowell assistant, on a highlight film mini-breakaway.

Move to 2004. The same four seeds make it to the Garden. On Friday, #2 Maine nips #8 BU, 1-0, and #3 UMass downs #4 UNH, 5-2. That sets up a final for the ages when Maine's Jimmy Howard and UMass' Gabe Winer put on a goaltending show into the third overtime. The Minutemen are denied their first ever Hockey East title when the Black Bears' Ben Murphy scores the game-winner.

The only other year where there 11 games in the Quarterfinal Round (like this year) was 1990. That also included a memorable final with BC downing Maine, 4-3. It was partly memorable as an outbreak of measles at Maine forced Hockeyfest I to be split up with the ECAC staying at the Garden and Hockey East moving to Boston College.
