Hockey East announced a two-year agreement with American Sports Network in September 2015 to televise Hockey East games through the 2016-17 season. The 2015-16 slate of games consisted of 14 contests, including nine conference matchups, the Women's Hockey East championship game and one men's playoff tilt. ASN will once again air 14 contests during the 2016-17 season.

ASN will also broadcast select Hockey East contests as part of a Friday night double-header, showcasing eastern college hockey programs at 6 p.m. ET followed by western teams at 8:30 p.m. and an all-Hockey East doubleheader Feb. 24 in the final weekend of regular season play.

The 2015-16 season saw unprecedented coverage of Hockey East on television across the country, with over 100 games airing on TV in all 50 states. Additionally, the New England Sports Network and NBCSN aired the Hockey East Championship weekend from TD Garden across the country, culminating in Northeastern University's first tournament title since 1988.

ABOUT THE JOE CONCANNON

HOCKEY EAST MEDIA AWARD: The prestigious honor, named in 2001 in memory of long-time Boston Globe sportswriter Joe Concannon, is bestowed annually upon a member of the media who has demonstrated a superior body of work in covering and promoting the Hockey East Association over an extended period of time.

Ted Ryan has superbly covered collegiate sports in the state of Vermont for over 40 years, first at the Rutland Herald until 1975 and since then at the Burlington Free Press. He retired as sports editor of the Free Press on Aug. 31, 2008 but continues to cover college hockey for the paper as a freelance correspondent.

Ted's knowledge and coverage of college hockey in the area is second to none. He has been the primary beat writer for the University of Vermont men's hockey team for over 40 winters. He has covered the program through its rise in ECAC Division II in the late 1960s and early 1970s, to the team's time in Division I first in ECAC Hockey from 1974 to 2005, to its current status as a member of Hockey East. At the same time he has done an excellent job with the other men's and women's hockey programs in the state and area including Saint Michael's, Middlebury, Norwich, Plattsburgh State and Castleton State.

His expertise is not just in hockey. Ted provided great coverage to all other collegiate sports in the state regardless of the season. He also found time to feature the success of many other Vermonters who competed at schools outside the state.
