- After finishing first in the conference standings for the first time in WHEA play, BC is looking to become the eighth team in WHEA history to win the regular season title and tournament crown in the same season. UNH accomplished that feat in four straight seasons, from 2006-09.

- The Terriers are looking for their third-straight tournament title, backstopped by senior goalie Kerrin Sperry (North Reading, Mass.), who has a 6-1-0 record with a 1.51 GAA and .944 save percentage in seven career WHEA playoff games. Providence is the only team that has appeared in the semifinals in every season since the WHEA began in 2002-03.

- Northeastern won ten straight conference games to close out the regular season, and they have also won their last ten meetings with UConn. Junior goalie Chloe Desjardins (Saint-Prospier, Que.) recorded both shutouts, making a combined 48 saves.
