No. 6 Terriers Head to Orono; No. 3 Boston College Hosts No. 5 Cornell New Hampshire Welcomes No. 7 Quinnipiac; UConn Travels to RPI

No. 3 Boston College vs. No. 5 Cornell

• In a match-up of top-ranked teams, No. 3 Boston College plays host to No. 5 Cornell for a pair of games in Chestnut Hill. BC comes off a 4-0 win over UNH on Sunday, marking the first career shutout for freshman netminder **Katie Burt**.

• Junior defenseman **Lexi Bender** took home her second Hockey East weekly award of the season, earning WHEA Defensive Player of the Week honors after tallying a goal and an assist in the win.

• Eagle forward **Alex Carpenter** added two points in the 4-0 win over UNH. Carpenter leads BC in points (9) and is tied for the lead in goals with four, while recording a point in every game this season.

No. 6 Boston University at Maine*

• The No. 6 Terriers come off a weekend sweep of defending NCAA champions No. 10 Clarkson in a pair of games. Friday night's win over the Golden Knights marked the first time a Hockey East team has knocked off the defending champions since 2007.

• **Senior Marie-Philip Poulin** posted three goals, including the game-winner on Friday night, and an assist. Her performance garnered Warrior Hockey Player of the Week accolades.

• BU and Maine meet for the first time this season. In 2014-15, the Terriers swept the season series, 3-0-0, en route to their third consecutive league title..

UConn at RPI

• Senior **Emily Snodgrass** helped power the Huskies last weekend, scoring two goals in Saturday's 2-1 win over Colgate, including the game-winning marker with five seconds remaining in regulation.

• UConn ends a seven-game road trip to start the season this weekend, carrying a 2-3-2 record, while RPI is looking for its first win of 2014-15 (0-4-1). The Huskies have squared off with RPI in 11 previous contests, trailing 3-6-2 in the series. Last season, UConn swept the Engineers in a pair of tilts in Connecticut.

New Hampshire vs. No. 7 Quinnipiac/at Dartmouth

• Sophomore forward **Haley Breedlove** registered her first career multi-point game with an assist and the game-winning goal to help UNH to a 2-1 win over RPI in the Wildcats home opener last weekend.

• Junior goaltender **Vilma Vaattovaara** matched her season high of 38 saves last Sunday. Vaattovaara has stopped 213 shots, tops in the nation, while only Kayla Black of Minnesota Duluth has played more minutes.

Northeastern at Robert Morris

• Freshman **Ainsley MacMillan** assisted on the game-winning goal in Friday night's win and scored her first collegiate goal on the way to earning Pro Ambitions Rookie of the Week honors.

• Through the Huskies' first four games, rookies have accounted for nine points, including five goals and six assists.

Providence vs./at Yale

• Providence grabbed its first point of 2014-15 with a 3-3 tie at Syracuse last weekend, while Yale is 2-0 in exhibition contests but has yet to play a regular-season game. The Friars hold a 25-6-2 all-time record against Yale, dropping last year's match-up, 5-1.

Vermont vs. Union

• The Catamounts are coming off of a weekend split with non-conference opponent RIT. Vermont took the first game 2-1 before falling 2-0 in the second match-up of the weekend.

• Junior **Dayna Colang** and sophomore **Victoria Andreacos** scored 3:24 apart in the third period of Vermont's come-from-behind win on Saturday.
