Three Home and Home Series on Tap This Weekend in League Play Vermont Travels to Face Non-League Opponent Syracuse

No. 1 Boston College vs. New Hampshire - Sat. 11/15 at BC; Sun. 11/16 at UNH *

- The No. 1 Eagles look to remain undefeated after wins over Northeastern and Vermont last weekend.
- Eagle senior forward **Kate Leary** found the back of the net four times against the Huskies and Catamounts en route to earning Warrior Hockey Player of the Week honors.
- The Wildcats enter the weekend series fresh off of a 5-1 win over Vermont, utilizing four different goal scorers in their first Hockey East victory of 2014-15.
- New Hampshire sophomore goaltender **Ashley Wilkes** earned Hockey East Defensive Player of the Week honors for her 21-save performance against the Catamounts.

No. 6 Boston University vs. UConn - Sat. 11/15 at UConn; Sun. 11/16 at BU *

- No. 6 Boston University looks to get back on track against UConn after skating to a 4-4 draw with Yale Saturday and falling to Northeastern, 6-3, in league play on Tuesday night.
- Senior defenseman **Shannon Doyle** has had at least one point in the Terriers' last seven games and leads the squad in assists with eight.
- UConn comes into this weekend after playing to a 4-4 tie at Providence last Sunday, erasing a 3-1 deficit. Seven different players recorded at least one point for the Huskies on the way to the tie.
- The Huskies last defeated the Terriers in the 2009-10 season and hold an all-time record of 8-17-3 against Boston University.

Northeastern vs. Providence - Sat. 11/15 at PC; Sun. 11/16 at NU *

- Northeastern bounced back from a loss to No. 1 Boston College over the weekend to defeat No. 6 Boston University Tuesday night.
- Junior forward **Kendall Coyne** recorded a hat trick and two assists Tuesday night. It was her first game with the Huskies after helping the U.S. Women's National Team to a second-place finish in the 4 Nations Cup.
- Providence enters the weekend after securing its first point in league play with a tie against UConn.
- PC senior forward **Brooke Simpson** scored a career-high two goals in the Friars efforts, including the game-tying goal at the end of regulation play.
- Friars freshman forward **Brooke Burquist** scored her first career goal in the UConn tie en route to earning Pro Ambitions Rookie of the Week honors.

Vermont vs. Syracuse - Fri. 11/14, Sat. 11/15 at Syracuse

- Vermont travels to take on non-conference opponent Syracuse after falling to New Hampshire and No. 1 Boston College in league play last weekend.
- Junior forward **Brittany Zuback** scored the lone goal for the Catamounts against the Wildcats and then recorded a goal and an assist against the Eagles for three points on the weekend.
- Vermont will face reigning College Hockey America Goaltender of the Week **Jenn Gilligan**, who helped the Orange to the program's first-ever win over No. 8 Mercyhurst with 28 saves in a 4-1 victory Saturday.
