Northeastern Takes on Two Top 10 Teams, Hosts No. 1 BC and Visits No. 6 BU Vermont and Maine Both Hit the Road; UConn Faces Friars in Providence

No. 1 Boston College at Northeastern*/vs. Vermont *

- The No. 1 Eagles are riding a five-game winning streak entering this weekend's league games with Northeastern and Vermont. Freshman goaltenders **Katie Burt** and **Gabiella Switaj** combined for BC's second shutout of the season in Friday night's 8-0 win over Providence.
- Boston College will be without **Alex Carpenter**, **Megan Keller**, **Emily Pfalzer**, **Haley Skarupa**, and **Dana Trivigno** this weekend while they are playing with the U.S. Women's National Team in the 4 Nations Cup in Kamloops, British Columbia.
- Northeastern returns to the ice after three games in the league last week. The Huskies will also be missing two players to Team USA's roster at in the 4 Nations Cup in juniors **Kendall Coyne** and **Paige Savage**.
- The Catamounts are coming into this weekend off of a 6-0 win over UConn in their first Hockey East game of the season. Senior captain **Amanda Pelkey** is also in Kamloops with Team USA playing in the 4 Nations Cup.

No. 6 Boston University at Yale/vs. Northeastern *

- The No. 6 Terriers posted a pair of wins in league play last week over Northeastern and New Hampshire. Junior forward **Rebecca Russo** tallied three goals, including the game-winners in both of BU's wins earning her Hockey East Warrior Hockey Player of the Week honors.
- Northeastern senior goaltender **Chloe Desjardins** kicked out 86 of 90 shots she faced in three games and posted her ninth career shutout.

UConn at Providence *

- UConn recorded a 1-1-1 record in three games last weekend, squaring off with Maine, Vermont and Brown.
- The Huskies claimed victory in non-league action by up-ending Brown, 4-2, Tuesday night. UConn got at least point from 10 different players and had four different goal scorers in the win.
- Freshman **Theresa Knutson** recorded two points in the three games, including goals in the Huskies tie with Maine and win over Brown.
- Providence senior **Allison Micheletti** recorded her first goal of the season while shorthanded in Saturday's loss to BC.

Maine at Brown

- Maine is coming of a tie at UConn and win at Northeastern heading into this weekend's series with non-conference opponent Brown.
- **Kristin Gilmour** scored the lone goal of the game to put the Black Bears in front of Northeastern half way through the first period of Saturday's victory.
- Sophomore goaltender **Mariah Fujimagari** turned away all 20 of the Huskies' shots en route to earning the shutout at Matthews Arena.

New Hampshire vs. Vermont *

- New Hampshire looks to bounce back from loses to league rivals Boston University and Northeastern this past weekend as the Wildcats play host to Vermont.
- Junior forward **Nicoline Jensen** recorded her first two points of the season for the Wildcats with a goal and an assist against the Terriers.
