Six Conference Games Highlight Weekend in Hockey East

No.1 BC Visits Vermont; UNH and UConn Square Off in Storrs; No. 6 BU Takes on City Rival Northeastern

No. 1 Boston College vs. Vermont * - Sat. 1/17, Sun 1/18 at UVM

- No. 1 Boston College hits the road this weekend after sweeping a home-and-home over Northeastern. The Eagles defeated the Huskies Saturday, 7-3, and Sunday, 9-1.
- BC had 12 different skaters find the back of the net and another five added assists in the offensive outburst. Junior forward **Alex Carpenter** scored five points (2g, 3a) and freshman forward **Megan Keller** led the charge for the Eagles with six points (2g, 4a).
- Senior defender **Emily Pfalzer** racked up six points en route to being named Women's Hockey East Defensive Player of the Week, scoring once and adding five helpers against Beanpot rival Northeastern.
- The Catamounts come into this weekend after dropping a series on the road at UConn.
- Junior forward **Dayna Colang** had the lone goal for the Cats on Saturday and Freshman forward **Mackenzie MacNeil** picked up three points on a goal and two assists in the two games.

No. 6 Boston University vs. Northeastern*/vs. No. 4 Quinnipiac - Sun. 1/18 at NU; Wed. 1/21 at BU

- No. 6 Boston University took down Maine in league action, 5-3, Saturday before falling to then-No. 10 Cornell in mid-week play Tuesday night, 2-6.
- The Terriers had five different players score in Saturday afternoon's win over Maine. Junior forward **Kayla Tutino** and senior forward **Marie-Philip Poulin** scored the only two goals for BU in the loss to Cornell.
- Northeastern looks to bounce back this weekend after dropping both games of a home-and-home series with No. 1 Boston College.
- **Denisa Křížová** recorded three points for the Huskies on the weekend (1g, 2a), and junior forward **Kendall Coyne** added a goal and an assist against a stingy Eagles defense.

UConn vs. New Hampshire * - Sat. 1/17 at UConn; Sun 1/18 at UConn

- UConn is coming into this weekend after sweeping league rival Vermont at home in a two-game series, claiming a 5-1 victory Saturday and topping the Cats, 4-3, Sunday. Senior forward **Sarah MacDonnell** potted the game-winning goal Sunday in UConn's come-from-behind win.
- Junior goaltender **Elaine Chuli** tied a UConn record with 55 saves in Saturday's 5-1 triumph over the Catamounts. Chuli earned her second straight Women's Hockey East Defensive Player of the Week honors for her performance, the fourth time she has won the award this season.

Maine vs. Providence * - Sun. 1/18 at PC

- Maine enters the weekend after falling at No. 4 Boston University Saturday, 5-3.
- Forwards **Jillian Langtry**, **Emilie Brigham**, and **Audra Richards** were the three Black Bears to find the back of the net in the loss.
- Providence comes into this weekend after a home-and-home sweep over New Hampshire. The Friars won at home Saturday, 3-1, before picking up a 4-1 road win Sunday.
- Six different players scored for Providence in the two victories. Senior forward **Beth Hanrahan** had four points (2g, 2a) in the two games and earned Warrior Hockey Player of the Week honors.
