No. 1 Boston College and New Hampshire Set to Face Non-Conference Foes Vermont Travels to Battle No. 6 Boston University; Northeastern and Maine Meet for a Pair

No. 1 Boston College vs. No. 3 Quinnipiac/vs. Princeton - Sat. 1/24, Mon. 1/26 at BC

- No. 1 Boston College remains unbeaten after sweeping Vermont on the road in league action this past weekend. The Eagles head into two non-conference match-ups this weekend when they play host to No. 4/3 Quinnipiac and Princeton.
- Junior forward **Alex Carpenter** tallied four points (2g, 2a) on the weekend en route to earning Warrior Hockey Player of the Week honors. Teammate **Katie Burt** turned away all 34 shots the Catamounts sent her way for her fifth and sixth shutouts of the season, earning the rookie netminder Hockey East Co-Defensive Player of the Week honors.

No. 6 Boston University vs. Vermont * - Sat. 1/24, Sun. 1/25 at BU

- No. 6 Boston University heads into this weekend's series after defeating Northeastern 4-3 in league action on Sunday and then-No. 4 Quinnipiac, 4-1, in a mid-week non-conference game Wednesday night.
- Senior forward **Marie-Philip Poulin** and junior forward **Kayla Tutino** lead the point charge for the Terriers in Wednesday night's victory with a goal and two assists apiece.
- Vermont looks to bounce back this weekend after being shutout by No. 1 Boston College in back-to-back home games in league play.
- Sophomore goaltender **Madison Litchfield** recorded a career-high 49 saves in the Catamounts' 2-0 loss to the Eagles on Sunday.

- UConn comes into this weekend's home-and-home series after dropping two games to New Hampshire this past weekend. The Huskies fell in overtime Saturday, 3-2, before dropping a 3-1 decision Sunday.
