Weekend Filled With Hockey East Games for All Eight Teams Teams Battle for Postseason Position As Playoffs Near

No. 1 Boston College vs. Providence */vs. Northeastern - Fri. 1/30 at PC; Tue. 2/3 at Harvard

• No. 1 Boston College extended its unbeaten streak to 25 games last weekend as they defeated non-conference opponents No. 5 Quinnipiac and Princeton.

• Junior forward **Haley Skarupa** assisted on the first goal of the contest against Quinnipiac Saturday afternoon before finding the back of the net in the second frame with what turned out to be the game-winner for the Eagles. Junior forward **Alex Carpenter** and senior forward **Kate Leary** lead the scoring charge in Monday afternoon's tilt with the Tigers, each scoring two goals in the 4-2 win.

• Providence comes into this weekend after splitting a home-and-home series with UConn. The Friars defeated the Huskies, 4-1, at home Saturday before falling, 4-1, on the road Sunday.

• In Saturday's win, the Friars found themselves down early, but came back with four unanswered goals to steal the victory. Senior forward **Allison Micheletti** had two goals in the win and added a helper in Sunday's loss.

• The Huskies enter this weekend after splitting a series with league opponent Maine on the road. Northeastern started off the weekend with a 5-2 win before falling to the Black Bears on Sunday, 4-2.

• Sophomore forward **Hayley Masters** had two goals and an assist on the weekend for the Huskies, while junior forward **Kendall Coyne** added a goal and three assists.

No. 7 Boston University vs. Connecticut */vs. No. 4 Harvard - Sat. 1/31 at UConn; Tue. 2/3 at Harvard

• No. 7 Boston University heads into this weekend's series after splitting two games at home against Vermont. In the first game of the series, the Terriers were shutout by the Catamounts, 2-0, before bouncing back Sunday to defeat UVM, 9-2.

• In Sunday's win, the Terriers got the scoring going early, recording five of their nine goals in the first period. Freshman forwards **Rebecca Leslie** and **Victoria Bach** paced the scoring Sunday, each finding the back of the net twice in the game.

• Sophomore goaltender **Victoria Hanson** posted a 0.60 goals against average and .976 save percentage over three games last week en route to earning Women's Hockey East Defensive Player of the Week honors.

• UConn looks to string two wins together after splitting a weekend with Providence. The Huskies fell, 4-1, on the road Saturday, but turned things around and defeated the Friars, 4-1, at home on Sunday.

• Freshman goaltender **Annie Belanger** stopped all eleven shots she faced upon entering Saturday afternoon's game before only allowing one goal in a 36-save effort Sunday. Her performance on the weekend earned her Pro Ambitions Rookie of the Week honors.

• The Black Bears seek their second consecutive win after claiming a 4-2 victory over Northeastern Sunday, after suffering a 5-2 loss at the hands of the Huskies Saturday.

• Senior forward **Jennifer More** had four points on the weekend with three goals and an assist. One of her goals came Saturday afternoon, before racking up three points in Sunday's win. Her four point effort earned her Warrior Hockey Player of the Week accolades.

• New Hampshire most recently split a weekend series with Penn State in non-league action. The Wildcats won, 2-0, Friday night before dropping a 3-1 decision Saturday.

• Junior goaltender **Vilma Vaattovaara** recorded 20 saves Friday night to seal the Wildcat win and earn the shutout.
