Seven Hockey East Contests On Tap for First Full Weekend in 2015 Boston University's Kayla Tutino Suspended One Game

Hockey East Commissioner **Joe Bertagna** has suspended Boston University senior forward **Kayla Tutino** for one game stemming from a hit from behind in last night's game at Boston College. She will miss Saturday afternoon's home game with Maine and will be eligible to return to action on Tuesday, January 13 at Cornell.

No. 1 Boston College vs. Northeastern * - Sat. 1/10 at NU; Sun 1/11 at BC

- No. 1 Boston College heads into the weekend after defeating No. 4 Boston University, 4-3, Wednesday night. Freshman forward **Tori Sullivan** scored two goals for the Eagles, including the game-winner.
- BC is home to four of the top five scoring leaders in the league: **Alex Carpenter** (20p), **Haley Skarupa** (17p), **Tori Sullivan** (14p), and **Emily Field** (14p).
- The Huskies prepare for the Eagles after falling to Dartmouth on New Years Eve and skating to a tie against UConn. Junior forward **Kendall Coyne** scored twice against the Huskies, including the game-tying goal early in the third period.

No. 4 Boston University vs. Maine */vs. No. 10 Cornell - Sat. 1/10 at BU; Tue. 1/14 at Cornell

- No. 4 Boston University is back on home turf in league action against Maine after falling in a hard fought battle to No. 1 Boston College on Wednesday night. The Terriers aren't home for long before heading off to take on No. 10 Cornell on Tuesday night.
- Senior forward **Marie-Philip Poulin** and junior forward **Kayla Tutino** put BU ahead early in the first period Wednesday night, scoring just 13 seconds apart, before **Sarah Lefort** struck with 30 seconds left in the first frame.
- The Black Bears are coming into their first league game of the second half of 2014-15 after falling in exhibition action to the University of Moncton, 5-1.
- Junior forward **Jillian Langtry** scored the lone goal for Maine against Moncton on a penalty shot in the third period.

UConn vs. Vermont * - Sat. 1/10, Sun 1/11 at UConn

- UConn is coming into this weekend after drawing a 3-3 tie against league opponent Northeastern Jan. 3 and falling in an 8-2 loss to No. 4 Harvard Jan. 6.
- Junior goaltender **Elaine Chuli** recorded 42 saves against Northeastern, including six stops in overtime, to help seal the tie en route to earning Hockey East Defensive Player of the Week honors.
- Vermont recently snapped a six-game losing streak with a pair of wins to sweep Colgate this past weekend.
- Senior forward **Delia McNally** tallied the game-winning goals in each of the one-goal victories for the Catamounts en route to earning Warrior Hockey Player of the Week accolades. Freshman forward **Taylor Willard** was also named Pro Ambitions Rookie of the Week after picking up two points against Colgate and assisting on McNally's game-winning goal.

New Hampshire vs. Providence */vs. No. 4 Harvard - Sat. 1/10 at PC; Sun. 1/11, Wed. 1/14 at UNH

- New Hampshire is back in action this weekend in their first game since the holiday break. The Wildcats welcome league opponent Providence and look to sweep the season series after a 5-0 victory Dec. 5, before playing host to No. 4 Harvard on Wednesday.
- In their last game before the break, UNH used four different scorers and eight point-getters to earn a 5-0 win over the Friars. Sophomore forward **Jonna Curtis** led the team with three points (2g, 1a) in the victory.
- Providence has skated twice in 2015 to date, falling, 3-1, to the Boston Blades in exhibition action Jan. 3 and tying RPI, 3-3, Jan. 6.
- Senior forward **Beth Hanrahan** had four points in the two games (3g, 1a).
