Boston University's Poulin Claims Warrior Hockey Player of the Month Terriers' Rookie Bach Named Best Freshman; UConn's Chuli Tabbed Top Netminder

Warrior Hockey Player of the Month **Marie-Philip Poulin – Boston University** Senior Forward; Beauceville, Quebec



Poulin lead the NCAA in February, picking up 17 points (5g, 12a) in nine games in February, including a pair of outings with four assists and five multi-point contests. With one goal and four assists in a two-game quarterfinal series, Poulin became the all-time leading scorer in Hockey East postseason history, notching her 17th tournament point (6g, 11a). Her 11 helpers are also tied for the all-time lead in league postseason history. In the month of February, her 12 assists led Hockey East and were second in the country. She averaged 1.89 points per game and won 65 percent of her faceoffs.

Pro Ambitions Rookie of the Month **Rebecca Bach - Boston University** Forward; Milton, Ontario



Bach collects Pro Ambitions Rookie of the Month honors for the first time this season after scoring more points (12) in February than any other first-year player in the NCAA with five goals and seven assists. Her five tallies tied for tops in the league among freshmen and her seven helpers ranked first in the nation for rookies. Bach had back-to-back three-point showings in WHEA quarterfinals and scored both game-winning goals in the two-game series.

Hockey East Goaltender of the Month **Elaine Chuli - UConn** Junior; Waterford, Ontario



Chuli turned in a 4-2-1 record in the month of February, backstopping the UConn Huskies to four consecutive victories at Maine to reach the Hockey East semifinals for the first time since 2010. Chuli stopped at least 40 shots three times in the month, bringing her season total of 40+ save performances to eight. She closed February with a 4-5-save shutout at Maine, securing the quarterfinal series win with a 1-0 overtime victory. In her seven appearances, only one came at home while four were at Maine's Alford Arena.
