Final Four Teams Set To Face Off at 13th Annual WHEA Championships Boston College Faces UConn; Boston University Takes on Northeastern

No. 1 Boston College vs. No. 5 Connecticut * - Sat. 3/7

• The top-seeded Eagles advanced to the ninth semifinal in program history by downing No. 8 Providence in a best-of-three quarterfinal series at Conte Forum.

• Senior and Patty Kazmaier finalist **Emily Pfalzer** recorded a goal and two assists against the Friars to become the first defenseman in Boston College history to register 100 career points.

• No. 5 UConn toppled No. 4 Maine on the road in two straight contests. Junior goaltender **Elaine Chuli** kicked out 45 shots for the Huskies in a 1-0 overtime win Saturday to send UConn back to the semifinal round for the first time since 2010.

• Boston College won the season series over UConn, 3-0-0, and scored 18 goals while allowing just one. BC and UConn have never met each other in the Hockey East playoffs.

No. 2 Boston University vs. No. 3 Northeastern * - Sat. 3/7

• No. 2 Boston University handed No. 7 Vermont two defeats at Walter Brown Arena in the quarterfinals, outscoring the Catamounts, 15-3.

• Junior forward **Kayla Tutino** scored a tournament record four goals in the first game of the series while senior forward **Marie-Philip Poulin** racked up four assists.

• The Terriers seek their fourth consecutive Hockey East title, and fifth in program history. **Brian Durocher's** squad has claimed the Bertagna Trophy each year the finals have been held in Hyannis (2012, 2013, 2014).

• No. 3 Northeastern is the lone semifinalist to skate in three quarterfinal games, using a hat trick from junior forward **Kendall Coyne** to down the Wildcats in a decisive Game 3 and propel the Huskies into the final four teams. Freshman forward **Denisa Krizova** collected a goal and five assists for six points in the series.

• BU and Northeastern have met four times this season already with the Terriers holding a 3-1-0 advantage, including a 3-1 win in the Beanpot.
