# FIVE POWER PLAY GOALS PUSH FRIARS PAST NU Kim Berry's return revitalizes UConn Huskies

There was plenty of good news around the Hockey East women's ranks last week. UConn's leading scorer from last season, Kim Berry, returned to the lineup and had two goals and two assists, leading the Huskies to a win and two ties. BC goaltender Lisa Davis also returned to action, but was upstaged by the heroics of Eagle counterpart Alison Quandt, who stopped 62 of 65 shots that came her way, earning a tie and a point vs. UConn and an overtime victory vs. Yale.

Providence inched past New Hampshire into first place with an overwhelming power play display that tallied five times in one game at Northeastern, a 6-3 Friar win. Player of the Week Kelli Halcisak had five points from her blueline position, while Rush Zimmerman and Hilary Greaves scored two goals apiece.

Not to be outdone, UNH used an inspired performance from sophomore Stephanie Jones (seven shots, GWG) to record a 3-1 win over Brown, a team which had dominated the Wildcats in their four previous meetings by a collective score of 13-1.

Maine was idle in the first week of 2003, but returns to action today and tomorrow, hosting Colgate.
