HUGGON WINS AT WISCONSIN, RECORDS 11TH SHUTOUT *Providence sweep sets up battle of the undefeated next weekend*

She may be third in the nation in GAA (1.53) and third in the nation in save percentage (.930), but UNH's Jen Huggon is far and away first in the shutout category, ringing up her 11th of the season (and fifth in a span of six games) this past weekend at Wisconsin. In the rematch, she allowed just one goal in a 1-1 tie. Senior forward Chandy Kaip scored two of UNH's three goals on the weekend and set up the other to lead the Wildcat offense.

In the past eight games, Huggon is 6-1-1 with a 0.74 GAA and a .965 save percentage. She is near-perfect in Hockey East play, having allowed just two goals total en route to a 9-0 record.

The Providence College Friars are determined to nip at her numbers this coming weekend in their first meeting of the season with UNH. The two Hockey East titans have a combined 17-0-1 record. Providence set up the undefeated battle with a home-and-home sweep against Northeastern over the weekend, winning 2-0 and 3-1. Sophomore Ashley Payton had both game-winners for the Friars. NU netminder Chanda Gunn matched a career high with 46 saves in the 2-0 loss at PC. UConn's Shannon Murphy one-upped her with a 51-save outing in a 5-2 loss at No. 4 Dartmouth.

Boston College kept the lid on Quinnipiac over the weekend, as netminder Lisa Davis allowed just one goal in a two-game sweep. Maine wasn't so lucky against Niagara, dropping both games. Jaren Sjogren scored three of Maine's five goals.

University of Connecticut: Shannon Murphy made a career-best 51 stops in the Huskies' 5-2 loss at No. 4 Dartmouth on Sunday.

University of Maine: Maine has dropped three straight after a five-game unbeaten streak ... Goaltender Dawn Froats suffered her first loss since Nov. 2, 2002 at UNH ... The 4-3 loss to Niagara on Saturday was Maine's first of the season when scoring more than two goals.

University of New Hampshire: The UNH program recorded its 499th victory all-time with a 2-0 win at Wisconsin Friday ... This season marks the 10th that UNH has reached the 20-win plateau ... The 'Cats have a 16-0-2 record when surrendering less than three goals in a game. They are 4-4-0 when allowing three goals or more ...
