### 'CATS GO WILD ON THE ROAD WITH SWEEP AT OHIO STATE NU goalie Chanda Gunn records her first shutout of the season

The University of New Hampshire provided all the headlines for the Hockey East women's league this weekend, sweeping a weekend series at No. 10 Ohio State. Midway through Friday's opener, defenseman Kristine Butt scored a power play goal that stood as the only score of the game. Behind 28 saves from senior stopper Jen Huggon, the Wildcats collected a strong 1-0 victory. Both teams released their offensive frustration in Saturday's rematch, combining for nine goals with New Hampshire dramatically prevailing 5-4 in overtime. Carolyn Gordon scored unassisted at 3:41 of the extra frame, completing her first career hat trick and the sweep for UNH. She has been selected as the TPS Louisville Player of the Week.

Rebounding from unsuccessful opening weekends, both Providence and Northeastern posted shutout victories over Vermont. Three different Friars scored two points each as Providence rolled, 6-0. Northeastern had to battle a little harder, holding a slim 1-0 lead until late in the third period when freshman defender Theresa Ella scored her first career goal. NU added an empty-net goal to win 3-0.

Despite strong efforts, Connecticut was unable to outplay visiting Wisconsin. The Badgers' 6-0 win Saturday was followed by a much closer 4-2 final on Sunday. Both Husky goals came on the power play.

The first battles between top-level ECAC and Hockey East rivals take place next weekend as St. Lawrence visits Northeastern and Providence.
