HOCKEY EAST TEAMS GO 9-3 IN NON-CONFERENCE WEEK BC, UNH, Providence contribute two victories each

The Women's Hockey East Association put a stamp on the national scene this past weekend, recording nine wins to offset just three losses against non-conference foes.

Most prominent of those was a sweep for New Hampshire (now 9-1-1 overall) against visiting Princeton, one of the ECAC's better programs. Player of the Week Carolyn Gordon had both UNH goals in Saturday's dramatic 2-1 overtime win and contributed another in Sunday's rematch, which the Wildcats won much more easily, 7-3. Chandy Kaip led the offense in Sunday's game with her first career hat trick to go with one assist.

Boston College sophomore Lindsey Bazzone shared Player of the Week honors with Gordon, posting back-to-back two goal games as Boston College exploded for 11 goals over two victories. Lisa Davis allowed just one goal against visiting Quinnipiac Tuesday but was upstaged by teammate Alison Quandt, who recorded a shutout Sunday against RPI.

Providence was also impressive, gaining two close wins at Ohio State (4-2) and Findlay (1-0). Jenn Butsch and Rush Zimmerman had two goals each against the OSU Buckeyes, who are coached by former Friar bench boss Jackie Barto. PC's Darlene Stephenson had the only goal for either team in Sunday's contest at Findlay.

Findlay was also shut out by Connecticut, who received 33 saves from rookie goalie Kaitlyn Shain. Northeastern split the weekend at Niagara, recovering from a 3-2 loss to post a 4-1 victory. At Quinnipiac, Maine split identical 2-0 victories with its host.
