UNH SWEEP LEADS 7-2-3 NON-CONFERENCE SHOWING UConn's Shannon Murphy records 45 saves in 2-2 tie vs. Providence

The Women's Hockey East Association completed a natural hat trick over the Thanksgiving week, recording its third consecutive dominant showing against non-conference opponents. Hockey East teams bettered non-conference foes seven wins to two, with three matches ending in a draw. Over a three-week span, Hockey East has compiled an impressive 20-5-3 record against interconference rivals.

New Hampshire humbled Niagara by scores of 7-4 and 6-2 to lift its overall record to 12-1-1. Senior Kristine Butt notched her first career hat trick Sunday, but there were plenty of other contributors on offense throughout the Wildcat roster.

Boston College also picked up a pair of convincing victories to run its winning streak to five straight. Sunday's triumph was just the second-ever for BC over Cornell, who owned the series at 12-1-1.

In a southerly trip, Maine tied at both Princeton and Yale, while Northeastern split the same set. Freshman Rebecca Paul was outstanding for the Huskies, recording both NU goals in a 6-2 loss at Princeton and contributing a goal and an assist in a 4-1 win at Yale.

UConn goaltender Shannon Murphy put in more work than any other Hockey East player on the week, making 114 total saves over three starts. Following a 47-save workout at No. 2 Harvard, Murphy added 45 more to keep the Providence offense at bay in a 2-2 tie, earning a key point in the standings. Special teams were key for the Huskies, who killed all eight Friar power plays and scored twice on four advantages of their own. Providence also tied Brown, 4-4, in the annual Mayor's Cup, rebounding from an early 3-0 deficit. The Friars are undefeated (6-0-2) in the last eight games.
