### RACE INTENSIFIES WITH UCONN SPLIT AT MAINE *Wildcat offense comes to life with 14 goals in weekend set vs. BC*

The race for the Hockey East tournament took a very interesting turn this past weekend when UConn managed a split at Maine to put the pressure on Northeastern. NU responded with a 2-1 comeback win over defending champ Providence. Though it's still too early to have anything solidified, it appears that a game of musical chairs has been set up for those four teams. Barring a late season collapse by first-place UNH, only three of those four teams can get a spot in the playoffs.

Boston College would have plenty of work to do to get back into the game. Eight straight league losses to open the season put the Eagles well behind the pace, although they have a respectable 5-3-2 non-league record. New Hampshire opened the floodgates vs. BC this weekend, scoring seven goals in each of two games to dominate the set. Lindsay Hansen, the 2002-03 Hockey East Rookie of the Year, picked up eight points over the two games to lead the offensive and was an easy selection as TPS Player of the Week. Wildcat rookie Lindsey Caleo posted her first career hat trick in Sunday's 7-2 win at BC and was named ITECH Rookie of the Week. Brittany Busa picked up her first career win in the game.

Maine opened the weekend with a 2-0 win over UConn, getting both goals from junior Tristan Desmet and 30 saves from goaltender Lara Smart. The Huskies solved Smart the next day, however, as Tiffany Owens potted two goals en route to a 3-2 win for Connecticut. That moved UConn into a tie with Providence, one point ahead of Northeastern.

The Friars, looking for solace following an 8-6 loss to No. 2 Dartmouth earlier in the week, jumped out to a 1-0 lead in their game at NU on Sunday. But host NU came back with two third period goals to win the game and the two points. Goaltender Chanda Gunn was the difference, stopping 35 of 36 shots faced in another strong performance.

**University of Connecticut:** Sara Mahoney's two assists on Saturday ran her season total to a team-leading seven ... The Huskies ended a five-game losing streak with their win at Maine Saturday.

**University of Maine:** Lara Smart recorded her first shutout of the season and fifth of her career Friday vs. UConn. On Saturday, she moved into a second-place tie on Maine's all-time games played list with 52.. Her career total of 1361 saves also ranks second ... The Black Bears have scored 47 goals and allowed 47 goals this season.

**University of New Hampshire:** Rookie goaltender Melissa Bourdon has an active shut-out streak of 143:09 ... UNH netted a season-high seven goals in back-to-back games vs. BC ...
