# PROVIDENCE SWEEPS UCONN FOR FIFTH STRAIGHT WIN Boston College challenge snuffed by NU's Chanda Gunn

The race for the Hockey East playoffs is coming into sharper focus late in the season. With just one loss in league play, UNH holds a five-point advantage over second place Providence and controls its own destiny in the quest for the regular season title. The 'Cats picked up three points in a weekend series at Maine, playing to a 2-2 draw Saturday after winning the opener, 5-2. A trio of rookies stood out for UNH. Sadie Wright-Ward had a key goal in each game, defenseman Martine Garland had a goal and two assists and Melissa Bourdon finished the weekend with 55 saves. Meagan Aarts and Karen Droog had one goal in each game for the Maine Black Bears.

The Providence College Friars made up one point of the deficit with a sweep vs. UConn, 3-1 on the road Saturday and 7-0 at home on Sunday. Junior sniper Rush Zimmerman had a hat trick and two assists in Sunday's lopsided victory and took over the Hockey East scoring lead. Rookie blueliner Kristin Gigliotti had the first two goals of her career and added a pair of assists. Goaltender Jana Bugden was 34-of-35 in the road win and needed to make just 10 saves for the home shutout on Sunday.

Northeastern also picked up a sweep to keep the pressure on Providence, posting back-to-back 2-1 wins vs. Boston College. BC got the first goal in each game (both by Kerri Sanders), but that was it against superstar Chanda Gunn, who totalled 102 saves on the week, including 51 in the Beanpot title game vs. No. 3 Harvard. BC's Lisa Davis edged Gunn for the Bertagna Award, presented annually to the 'Pot's Most Outstanding Goaltender, but couldn't beat Gunn head-to-head, despite making 58 saves on 62 shots (.935 save percentage) in the weekend set.
