EIGHT IN A ROW FOR STREAKING FRIARS Maine and Northeastern split, gain ground ahead of Connecticut

Defending Hockey East champ Providence is making a late season run at first-place UNH, posting eight consecutive wins, seven in league play, since losing to UNH on Jan. 31. The Friars opened last week with a dramatic 2-1 overtime win at No. 10 Brown, as rookie Sonny Watrous potted the winner at the 4:27 mark of OT. Goaltender Jana Bugden turned aside 24 of 25 shots and assisted on the Friars' first goal.

Bugden was given the weekend off in a series vs. Boston College. As it turned out, she wasn't needed, as the Friars poured in 13 goals on 94 shots to sweep the two-game set. Junior Ashley Payton had a goal in each of three wins on the week and added two assists.

UNH maintained their five-point cushion ahead of Providence by ousting UConn in back-to-back contests. TPS Player of the Week Carolyn Gordon had two goals and one assist in the opener, a 4-1 home win for UNH, and ITECH Rookie of the Week Nicole Hekle did the honors in the rematch, scoring one goal and setting up five of the six others as UNH rolled to a 7-2 win in Storrs, CT. Hekle's six points established a new Hockey East record and tied the league record for assists in a single game.

Maine visited Northeastern for two games this past weekend and came away with a split, thanks to a three-goal rally in the closing minutes Saturday that turned a 2-0 deficit into a 3-2 victory for the Black Bears. Northeastern got the victory in Friday's opener, winning 4-3 thanks to 34 saves from goaltender Chanda Gunn.

UNH and Providence will wrap up their season series with a home-and-home set next weekend. A sweep by UNH would secure the regular season title for the Wildcats while a sweep by Providence would set up a thrilling to-the-wire conclusion to the season. Northeastern takes on UConn in a home-and-home series and can lock up a playoff spot with a win in either of those games.






