FRIARS REPEAT AS HOCKEY EAST CHAMPIONS Two-time MVP Kelli Halcisak leads the way with a goal in each game

Hockey East's most ferocious rivals met on common ice once again Sunday, facing off for the second consecutive season to determine the league champion-ship. Predictably, it was an intense battle until the very end, but ultimately the defending champion prevailed once again.

The Providence College Friars, thanks to the intensity and effort of senior defenseman Kelli Halcisak, and to the sure hands and pads of sophomore goaltender Jana Bugden, have repeated as Hockey East champions. Bugden was perfect when it counted, stopping all 24 shots she faced in the title game to deal regular season champion UNH just its second shutout of the season. Halcisak scored the opening goal in PC's 4-2 semifinal victory over Maine and added another in the third period of the championship game to break up a stern defensive stalemate. That goal took the wind out of UNH's sails. Despite the fact that they took three of four games vs. Providence in the regular season series, including an overtime thriller to clinch the regular season title, the UNH Wildcats could not answer Halcisak's tally. The Friars added a late goal for insurance (Karen Thatcher's second of the tournament) and began the celebration with Rush Zimmerman's empty-netter in the final minute. It soured a strong effort by UNH rookie stopper Melissa Bourdon, who made 30 saves in the game to follow up a 20-save shutout the day before vs. host Northeastern.

The Huskies couldn't get much going vs. the UNH team, suffering a 5-0 shutout. Maine threatened Providence, however, holding a 2-1 lead after one period and retaining a 2-2 tie until midway through the third. Senior goaltender Lara Smart had 40 saves to keep the Black Bears in the game until the end.

Karen Droog is tops in career goals (74). Naomi Smethurst is the all-time leader in games played (128), having never missed a game. Lara Smart is the all-time leader in single season games played by a goaltender (30) and single season saves (892).

University of New Hampshire: Kristen Thomas has tied Cindy MacKay's school record for career points by a defenseman with 108 ... Stephanie Jones recorded her 100th career point with a goal and assist in the semifinal game vs. NU ... Melissa Bourdon shut out NU on its home ice for the third time this season in Saturday's semifinal. UNH was shut out for just the second time this season in the championship game vs. Providence.

Northeastern University: Senior goalie Chanda Gunn is one of three finalists for the Patty Kazmaier Award. The winner will be announced Saturday in Providence, RI. She is also one of five finalists for the Hockey Humanitarian Award which will be presented in Boston on Friday, April 9. Gunn finished her career as the school's all-time leader in saves (2447) and save percentage (.936). She ended the season ranked first in the nation in save percentage (.938).

Providence College: The Friars have won three consecutive league titles, dating back to their ECAC Eastern League title in 2002 ... The two goals the Friars gave up to Maine on Saturday are the only goals that the Friars and sophomore goaltender Jana Bugden have surrendered in Hockey East tournament action. They have allowed just two goals in four games ... Head Coach Bob Deraney became the first coach in Providence history to record 20-win seasons in four of his first five seasons at the helm.




