NORTHEASTERN NETS THIRD SHUTOUT IN HOT START 3-1-2 squad led by goaltender Chanda Gunn

Chanda Gunn is usually the one putting up the zeroes in front of the Northeastern net, but backup Katy Augustyn did the honors Sunday, stopping all 28 shots she faced in dealing Niagara a 2-0 defeat. It was Augustyn's collegiate debut, but her numbers looked more like those of the veteran Gunn, who was sitting out the game with an injury. Gunn played the entirety of Saturday's 2-2 tie with Niagara, surrendering two goals on 30 shots, and stopping 13 of the 14 shots she faced over six Niagara power plays.

The Huskies will need Augustyn in peak shape next weekend when they host Yale and Princeton as Gunn will be absent again, this time with the U.S. Women's Select Team, which will be competing in the Four Nations Cup in Sweden. Five other players representing four different Hockey East programs will serve as Gunn's teammates in the elite tournament: Sara DeCosta (Providence '00), Tricia Dunn (UNH '95), Cammie Granato (Providence '93), Shelley Looney (Northeastern '94) and Gen Richardson (BC '03).

Princeton poses a significant threat to Northeastern, having just knocked off the other Huskies of Hockey East in a weekend sweep at UConn. Yale also proved worthy of Hockey East competition, out-duelling Maine in a very low-scoring weekend with a 1-0 win on Saturday followed by a 2-2 tie on Sunday. Maine's Lara Smart was near the top of her game, stopping 55 of 58 shots on the weekend, but she did not receive much in the way of support from the Black Bear offense.

In other non-league action this past weekend, UNH suffered a 3-2 loss Sunday at North Dakota following a convincing 6-2 victory on Saturday. Wildcat rookie Nicole Hekle broke out for three goals in the split. At Dartmouth, Providence mounted a two-goal comeback after falling behind 3-0 to the No. 2 ranked squad in the nation, but the Big Green struck back hard with four goals in the final 10 minutes of a 7-2 win. BC picked up a 4-1 win over Union Sunday after yielding to Vermont 3-1 on Thursday.
