UNH EMERGES WITH SPLIT VS. NO. 5 ST. LAWRENCE
Northeastern sweeps ECAC foes to extend unbeaten streak to seven

Nine seconds away from concluding a 1-1 tie in Friday's prime time bout vs. No. 5 St. Lawrence, the UNH Wildcats surrendered the winning goal to SLU's Ricki-Lee Doyle. The Saints' ecstasy was short-lived, however, as the 'Cats stormed back with renewed determination, powering out a 6-3 win on Sunday. Stephanie Jones rang up three goals and defenseman Allison Edgar scored two of her own to give the Wildcats a dominating 6-1 lead early in the third period. The UNH power play went 4-for-8 on the day to recover from an 0-for-5 showing in Friday's loss.

Northeastern opened the weekend with a 6-3 win over Yale. The Husky offense ran wild, (reaching the six-goal mark for the first time since a 6-1 win over Quinnipiac last November,) but it was sophomore goaltender Katy Augustyn who made the difference vs. Yale, stopping 37 of the 40 shots she faced in just the second start of her career. Amazingly, Augustyn topped the performance the very next day, making 41 saves (including four in a 2:51 span in overtime) vs. Princeton. NU's Theresa Ella found the back of the net in OT and the Huskies came away with a 3-2 win and a sweep of the weekend action at home. Northeastern has now won three straight and is undefeated in the last seven after losing the season opener at St. Lawrence.

UConn and Boston College both picked up a single win on the weekend. Connecticut picked up the W vs. state rival Quinnipiac, hosting a 2-1 victory on Friday night. BC handed Brown a 3-1 loss on Saturday before dropping a 5-0 decision to Yale on Sunday.

Maine suffered a pair of one-goal losses on the weekend, spoiling the fine efforts of senior goaltender Lara Smart. Smart stopped 39 of 40 shots faced at Brown on Friday, only to lose 1-0, and then stopped 30 of 32 shots in regulation before surrendering an overtime goal vs. Princeton.

Providence was idle this past week in preparation for one of its toughest matches of the season – Tuesday night at home vs. Harvard. It will be a rematch of a classic from last season in which the Crimson prevailed 2-1, scoring the game-winner with just 16 seconds left in overtime. In a challenging week, the Friars must also travel to No. 10 Princeton for a Sunday afternoon faceoff.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: Lisa Davis totalled 46 saves on the weekend, including a 12-of-13 showing to post a 3-1 win at Brown.

University of Connecticut: 15 different Huskies have scored at least one point ... UConn held a dominating 43-17 advantage in shots against Quinnipiac, marking just the second time the Huskies have out shot an opponent this season ... Freshman Leslie Hurlburt scored her first career goal.

University of Maine: Maine's last three losses have all been by just one goal. Only once this season has Maine been involved in a game decided by more than one goal ... Karen Droog (97 career points) and Meagan Aarts (96) are each closing in on the 100 point plateau.

University of New Hampshire: UNH has held the shot advantage in all six games this season, including an 86-29 mark in the second period ... Six of the nine goals scored in UNH's 6-3 victory vs. St. Lawrence came when the Wildcats were on the power play. UNH scored four power play goals and SLU netted a pair of shorthanded tallies.

Northeastern University: NU's current seven-game unbeaten streak is the teams longest since it won nine in a row from Jan. 12 to Feb. 2 during the 2001-02 season ... Sophomore Katy Augustyn is 3-0-0 in her first three collegiate starts with a .955 save percentage and a 1.62 GAA ... NU freshmen have accounted for 10 of the team's 22 goals.

Providence College: Senior Darlene Stephenson is just five points shy of breaking the 100 points mark in her career.
