LANDMARK WEEKEND AS UCONN SWEEPS PROVIDENCE BC inches ahead of Maine with only six games left to play

RELEASE

There is little question that UNH and Providence are the dominant teams in Hockey East and have been so in all three seasons of Hockey East's existence. Providence won the first regular season title and UNH won the second. Providence defeated UNH in each of the first two tournament championship games. In fact, there have been only two occasions in three seasons that either team has lost to any of the other four Hockey East teams, that being when Providence lost two one-goal decisions at Maine and at Northeastern last year.

That all changed this past weekend when UConn not only defeated Providence for the first time ever, but swept the Friars in a home-and-home series (5-3, 3-2) that rocked the establishment and set up the Huskies as darkhorse title contenders. They'll host UNH for two games next weekend and can further their image as a legitimate threat with another solid showing.

The power play was a key factor in the Husky sweep, as UConn converted on five of nine opportunities on the weekend. Both game-winning goals came in the third period when the Huskies had the man advantage. Defensive Player of the Week Alicia Ramolla, a UConn defenseman, set up four of UConn's eight goals and the weekend and played a vital role in both the penalty kill and power play for the Huskies. Blueline partner Natalie Vibert led Sunday's 3-2 victory with the game-winning goal and two assists. Providence outshot the Huskies by a nearly 2-to-1 margin (58-31) but UConn junior Kaitlyn Shain was solid between the pipes, keeping the Friars at arm's length to pick up both wins.

UNH also swept a league weekend, dominating back-to-back games at Maine. Player of the Week Stephanie Jones had two goals in each game to extend her lengthy goal-scoring streak to eight games. Melissa Bourdon stopped 34 of 36 shots Saturday to preserve a 5-2 victory and one-upped herself with 28 saves on 28 shots in a 5-0 shutout win on Sunday.

Northeastern was overpowered by Harvard 9-1 in the first round of the Beanpot, but Boston College emerged victorious by the same score over BU's club team. Later in the week, BC and NU skated to a 4-4 tie with three different players picking up two goals each. With the tie, the Eagles snuck ahead of Maine for the vital fourth-place spot in Hockey East, which carries with it the final berth in the Hockey East tournament. BC will seek to knock off Harvard in Tuesday's Beanpot finale. Harvard has won six straight Beanpots.
