CONNECTICUT HAS THE LOOK OF A CONTENDER UConn Huskies take three of four points from first-place UNH

The established power structure in Hockey East is no more.

Following a sweep of two-time champion Providence a week prior, the UConn Huskies took three out of four points in a two-game series vs. first-place UNH this past weekend, solidifying their status as legitimate Hockey East title contenders. The Wildcats outshot the host Huskies by a 2-to-1 margin (34-to-17) in the opener on Saturday but UConn goaltender Kaitlyn Shain was up to the task, stopping every shot she faced. UNH's Brittany Busa was her equal at the other end, and the game ended in a 0-0 deadlock. In the rematch, Shannon Connolly and Jaclyn Hawkins connected for two goals and Megan Mcleod made it 3-0 before UNH made it interesting with two goals late in the second period. Shain stopped 30 of 32 shots faced, including all 12 faced in the third period.

Boston College threw its own wrench into the mix with an unexpected 4-1 win at Providence on Saturday, scoring three third-period goals in less than a minute to put the game away. The Friars unleashed 43 shots on goal, only to see BC 'tender Alison Quandt turn aside 42 of them. But the Friars outduelled Quandt on Sunday, picking up a 4-2 win at BC courtesy of two goals and one assist coming from senior Rush Zimmerman.

Looking to keep BC at bay in the hunt for the final playoff spot, the Maine Black Bears registered a sweep at home vs. Northeastern. Senior Tristan Desmet led the way in the first game, scoring the opening goal and the game-winner in a 3-2 triumph. Maine held control throughout the rematch, winning 5-0 behind an 16-save shutout victory for goaltender Rachel Gettings.

Maine is only one point ahead of Boston College, and must play two against BC in Boston next weekend. Saturday's game will be played at Northeastern's Matthews Arena due to a scheduling conflict at BC's Conte Forum.

If that's not enough to pique the interest of Hockey East fans, don't forget that UNH and Providence will have a home-and-home set next weekend as well. UNH can win its second consecutive regular season title with three points in the set.

University of Maine: Maine is undefeated at 11-0-1 when scoring three or more goals in a game this season but only 3-11-2 when scoring two or less.

University of New Hampshire: Saturday's scoreless tie was just the second in the 741game history of the program. The other occurred Jan. 30, 1999, vs. Minnesota ... Prior to surrendering three goals to UConn on Sunday, the Wildcats had allowed just four goals in the previous five games.
