# PROVIDENCE, UNH SHARE REGULAR SEASON TITLE But BC and UConn look primed entering tournament

Call it a draw for Providence and UNH, a fitting ending to the regular season for the two teams that have battled for three years for Hockey East supremacy.

Providence got a scare at Northeastern Saturday, rallying back from an early 3-1 deficit to take a 4-3 lead, only to be tied up in the closing minutes. But four shots in the first minute of OT yielded the winning goal from rookie blueliner Kathleen Smith. Smith figured prominently in the rematch as well, sending Karen Thatcher on a successful short-handed breakaway in the final minute that gave PC a narrow 2-1 victory. NU's Marisa Hourihan made 51 saves in the contest.

The dramatic win secured the No. 1 seed for Providence and a share of the regular season title with UNH, who swept Boston College. The Wildcats swarmed Saturday at home, posting a 10-2 win over the Eagles, with hat tricks from both Lindsay Hansen and Jennifer Hitchcock. Defenseman Jackie Wedster had a goal and three assists and finished the game with an outstanding +6 rating. Sunday's rematch at BC was not nearly as one-sided, as the two teams were 1-1 deep into the third before Hansen scored the game-winner. Nicole Hekle had five points on the weekend to edge PC's Karen Thatcher for the Hockey East scoring title.

Despite the two losses, the Boston College Eagles are headed to the postseason for the first time since joining the Hockey East, and will face Providence in the noon semifinal on Saturday at BU's Walter Brown Arena. The Friars posted three two-goal victories vs. BC this year, but the Eagles notched a 4-1 win in the other game of the season series.

In the other semifinal, UNH will take on UConn, the hottest team in Hockey East. The Huskies are undefeated in their last eight games (6-0-2) which includes two wins vs. Providence and a win and a tie vs. UNH. This past weekend, UConn swept host Maine by scores of 3-2 and 4-1. Rookie Jaclyn Hawkins led the way with two goals and three assists and won Hockey East's goal-scoring crown with 18 goals in just 18 league games played. Junior goal-tender Kaitlyn Shain stopped 37 shots in each contest.
