TWO LEAGUE VICTORIES LIFT UNH TO 5-0 OVERALL Providence powers past Vermont, 2-1 and 5-0

Starting hot is nothing new to UNH or head coach Brian McCloskey. The third-year skipper began his career with a 7-0 run to face off the 2002-03 season. This year, the Wildcats have raced out to a 5-0 opening and are 2-0 in Hockey East play after victories over Connecticut and Boston College this past weekend.

Stephanie Jones was the top star in the league opener on Friday, potting a goal and two assists in a 4-0 win over Connecticut. The Huskies scored nine goals in two games vs. St. Lawrence last weekend, but couldn't solve the UNH defense or sophomore goaltender Melissa Bourdon, who finished with 12 saves on the evening and stopped 24 of 25 shots faced on the weekend. Kaitlyn Shain, her counterpart at the UConn end, was impressive with 37 saves against a ranked opponent on the road, but she did not get enough offensive support to translate the effort into a win.

The only goal Bourdon gave up came on a 5-on-3 disadvantage Sunday at Boston College. Eagle rookie Sarah Feldman potted her fifth goal of the year and second of the weekend in the game, but neither was enough to get BC a win. UNH rolled to a 6-1 win thanks to a pair of goals each from rookies Jessica Zerafa and Leah Craig. The other game for Boston College was a slim 3-2 loss at Quinnipiac on Saturday.

Like UNH, Providence picked up two wins, defeating Vermont twice. Saturday's game was a close affair that was won 2-1 courtesy of two goals from sophomore Sonny Watrous. The 2003-04 Hockey East Rookie of the Year added another goal and two assists to finish the sweep on Sunday by a final of 5-0. Junior Karen Thatcher pitched in two goals late in the game to go with an earlier assist. Goaltender Amy Thomas allowed only one goal on 24 shots faced over the two games. Northeastern wasn't as successful in a two-game trip to Niagara, losing both by convincing margins.
