# OWENS, MURPHY LEAD UCONN TO NUTMEG CLASSIC TITLE UNH remains perfect with a 2-1 win over ninth-ranked Brown

The University of Connecticut recorded its first wins of the season in a big way last week, posting back-to-back narrow 2-1 triumphs in the Nutmeg Classic Tournament, defeating Yale and Quinnipiac. Senior forward Tiffany Owens scored a goal in each game and added one assist and was subsequently named Tournament MVP. Teammate Shannon Murphy got plenty of work, facing 57 shots over the two games and stopping 55 of them. Her outstanding .965 save percentage afforded her the Laurie Beliveau Award as the tournament's top goaltender.

Boston College and Northeastern also recorded their first wins of the season, over Vermont and Quinnipiac, respectively. The Huskies got the week started off right for Hockey East, shutting out Quinnipiac 3-0 thanks to 30 saves for goaltender Marissa Hourihan. BC, meanwhile, recovered from a humbling 7-1 loss at No. 2 Dartmouth to post a 3-1 win at Vermont. Rookie Deborah Spillane had a goal in each game and fellow freshman Sarah Feldman assisted on both.

After Brown dispatched Maine 3-0 on Friday, the Bears travelled south for a Sunday
