LISA DAVIS LEADS EAGLES AT MAINE

Overtime the order of the week as six of nine games need extra session

Showing no ill effects of a recent bout with mononucleosis, senior Lisa Davis put 80 saves on the board in her first full action of the season, a two-game series at Maine, earning BC a 3-2 win on Saturday and a 2-2 tie on Sunday. Those are the first league points of the season for BC, who entered the weekend 0-3. Davis was spectacular in the opener, turning aside 46 of 48 Maine attempts to set up Sarah Feldman's short-handed game-winner late in the third period. In the rematch, Maine was again frustrated by Davis, managing just two goals on 36 shots. But that was enough for a 2-2 tie that salvaged a point out of the weekend for the Black Bears. BC rookie Colleen Harris had one goal and one assist in each game to lead all scorers.

University of Connecticut head coach Heather Linstad became only the eighth coach in women's collegiate hockey history to record 200 victories when UConn defeated North Dakota 5-2 on Saturday afternoon. The victory capped a successful weekend for the Huskies vs. the Sioux and extended UConn's undefeated streak to a team-record six games (5-0-1). North Dakota stopped UConn's four-game win streak with a 2-2 tie on Friday, but the Huskies came back with the 5-2 triumph. Junior goaltender Kaitlyn Shain stopped 34 shots for the win, and Tiffany Owens contributed two assists to cap a three-point weekend.

UNH took a sterling 7-0-0 record to No. 7 St. Lawrence this past weekend, and opened well enough with a 2-2 tie on Saturday. Stephanie Jones had a goal and an assist and Melissa Bourdon stopped 29 SLU shots. The Saints got to Bourdon on Sunday, however, putting five goals in en route to a 5-3 triumph. UNH got two goals from rookie Leah Craig in the loss.

Northeastern required overtime in both games at Ohio State, but came up short of victory. On Saturday, NU's Stephanie Wood netted the equalizer with just 40 seconds left to play to give the Huskies a 1-1 tie. In Sunday's rematch, NU again needed a tying goal in the final minute to force overtime, but Ohio State converted in the extra session to saddle NU with a 6-5 loss despite a hat trick from Amy Goodney.

Earlier in the week, Providence got a goal and an assist from sniper Rush Zimmerman to record an impressive 2-2 tie at third-ranked Harvard. Amy Thomas had 31 saves to preserve the tie, brought about by a goal by Karen Thatcher with under two minutes remaining in regulation.

Boston College: The line of Sarah Feldman, Deborah Spillane and Colleen Harris combined for 10 points in the two games against Maine. Feldman scored BC's first short-handed goal of the season with the game-winner on Saturday.

University of Connecticut: Six of UConn's seven goals on the weekend were scored by seniors ... The Huskies are on a school-record six-game unbeaten streak.

University of Maine: After going scoreless on their first 41 power play attempts this year, the Black Bears got two power play goals in Sunday's 2-2 tie vs. BC.
