PROVIDENCE SWEEPS IN FIRST LEAGUE ACTION UConn keeps eight-game unbeaten streak alive with two road ties

Riding a wave of momentum, the UConn Huskies recorded back-to-back 2-2 ties at Minnesota State last weekend to run their unbeaten streak to eight straight games, by far the longest in the program's history. Less than thirty seconds away from concluding the streak Saturday afternoon, the Huskies got a goal from Tiffany Owens at the 19:35 mark of the third to tie the score for the second straight day. Shannon Murphy was once again strong between the pipes, recording 32 saves on Friday and 29 on Saturday to lift her record to 4-1-3. The senior now boasts an enviable 1.50 GAA and .925 save percentage. Murphy and the Huskies will put their run on the line with their toughest stretch of the season directly ahead, two games at Princeton followed by single games against UNH. Harvard and Brown, Northeastern also has a tough string ahead, playing WCHA powerhouses Minnesota and Wisconsin in the Harvard Shootout later this week.

Two-time defending Hockey East tournament champ Providence saw its first league action of the season and came away with back-to-back wins at Maine. A team effort from the Friars trumped a strong showing from Maine's Tristan Desmet, who potted two of Maine's four goals and set up one other in the weekend set. PC rookie Kelli Doolin set up two scores in Friday's 3-2 triumph and potted a short-hander in Saturday's rematch, a 4-2 Friar victory. Hilary Greaves had a goal in each game for Providence.

Northeastern got its first league win of the season thanks to the efforts of the line of Amy Goodney, Nikki Petrich and Crystal Rochon, which accounted for all four goals in a 4-2 win over BC on Friday. NU goaltender Marisa Hourihan made 31 saves to spoil strong outings from Eagles Kerri Sanders (2 goals) and Deborah Spillane (2 assists). Both players continued their hot streaks on Sunday, contributing three points each in a convincing 7-4 win vs. Quinnipiac. Rookie Colleen Harris had a goal and three assists in the contest.

The hottest hand of the weekend, however, belonged to UNH's Lindsay Hansen, who scored one goal and set up four others in a single game against Northeastern. The Wildcats cruised to a 7-1 win thanks to Hansen, but also received big contributions from Nicole Hekle (2 goals, 1 assist) and freshman Leah Craig (3 assists).

University of Maine: The line of Tristan Desmet, Andrea Steranko and Cheryl White has scored 10 of Maine's 18 goals this year.


