HAWKINS, SHAIN TEAM UP TO TAKE DOWN PROVIDENCE BC and BU both bring hot streaks into Tuesday's prime time battle

In a rematch of the 2005 Hockey East championship game, UConn's Jaclyn Hawkins staked the host Huskies to a 3-1 first period lead over three-time defending champ Providence with her third career hat trick. Senior goaltender Kaitlyn Shain did the rest, stopping all but one of 38 shots she faced en route to the 3-1 victory. A lopsided 0-18-2 all-time record vs. Providence entering last season has suddenly taken a turn, as the Huskies are 3-2-1 in their last six games vs. the Friars.

First-year varsity squad Boston University got its first-ever win, downing Union 4-1 on Friday to start a two-game sweep. The Terriers went 2-0-1 on the week, led by Gina Kearns' three goals and two assists.

Boston College is also making noise, picking up wins over Quinnipiac and Maine. Co-Player of the Week Deb Spillane looks to be in midseason form, contributing five points to the two wins, including scoring the overtime winner vs. Quinnipiac. On Tuesday, the Eagles will visit BU in the first-ever varsity meeting between the two squads, chapter one in what promises to be an excellent new rivalry.

In other league action, preseason favorite UNH downed Maine 4-1 on Saturday. Northeastern and Vermont were both swept in non-league play vs. Top 10 opponents, but a special impression was made by UVM goaltender Katie Nichols, who stopped 63 of 68 shots faced in Saturday's 5-0 loss at No. 2 Wisconsin.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: The freshman trio of Meghan Fardelmann, Maggie Taverna and Becky Zavisza have combined for six points in just two games. Last year, it was another freshman trio (Sarah Feldman, Colleen Harris and Sarah Feldman) that clicked, as the three combined for 44 goals and 85 points overall.

Boston University: BU has a modest three-game undefeated streak and is averaging over four goals a game this season ... Gina Kearns has recorded a point in each of the Terriers' four games.

University of Connecticut: 2004-05 Rookie of the Year Jaclyn Hawkins has picked up right where she left off, notching a hat trick vs. Providence on Saturday. She also won 25 faceoffs ... The Huskies were 0-18-1 all-time vs. Providence at the start of last season, but are 3-2-1 in their last six games vs. the Friars since then.

University of Maine: Despite suffering a 5-3 loss at BC Sunday, the Black Bears scored both a short-handed goal and a power play goal vs. the Eagles. Cheryl White had the power play marker and now has five points on the season, the best among Hockey East players. Pam Patterson got the short-hander. It was her first collegiate goal.

University of New Hampshire: With a 4-1 win over Maine Saturday, UNH improved to 25-3-1 in season openers. The Wildcats have outscored the opposition 159-59 in 29 season openers ... UNH's goal 16 seconds into the game vs. Maine marked the second-fastest season-opening goal in the 29-year history of the program. The 'Cats scored nine seconds into the opener of the 1981-82 season ... UNH scored on three of seven power-play opportunities vs. Maine.

Northeastern University: Goaltender Sarah Belliveau played Friday's contest vs. Ohio State, marking the first time that a goalie other than Marisa Hourihan has appeared between the pipes for the Huskies since the final game of 2004. Hourihan made 49 saves in the 6-2 loss on Saturday, the 17th time over the last two years she has made more than 40 saves in a game ... The line of Nikki Petrich, Amy Goodney and Ashley Bielawski has produced four goals in three games so far this season.

Providence College: Head Coach Bob Deraney enters his seventh season at Providence. He needs just one win to reach the 125 mark.

University of Vermont: Katie Nichols' 63 saves Saturday was 23 more than her career total of 40 over six previous appearances ... UVM has used two different goalies in the same game twice already this season, after only doing so twice all of last year ... UVM has suffered three consecutive shutouts, having not scored a goal in a span of 225:16.
