TERRIERS NEVER QUIT, SCORE TWO TIES AND A WIN Maine makes noise with dramatic 1-0 overtime win over UConn

The Boston University Terriers are making quite a name for themselves in their first year as a varsity squad. After a slim 4-3 loss in their season opener at Northeastern, the team has put together an impressive six-game undefeated streak, capped by their first-ever league win on Sunday at Vermont. Their biggest feat of the week wasn't the win, however, but the two 3-3 ties they managed despite being down 3-0 in each game. They stormed back to tie BC in the first-ever varsity meeting between the two storied rivals on Tuesday, and then outshot the Eagles 5-1 in the overtime session. Saturday's comeback at Vermont was even more stunning, as they potted two extra attacker goals in the final two minutes to quickly equal up a 3-1 deficit.

The league ranks continued to be rattled when Maine outlasted 2005 Hockey East tournament runner-up UConn, 1-0 in overtime on Saturday, courtesy of a goal from Kelly Law and 20 saves from Genevieve Turgeon. Just a day later, Northeastern skated out of Alford Arena with one point in the standings thanks to a 1-1 tie.

UNH made quick work of visiting Niagara on the weekend, posting back-to-back wins of 6-0 and 8-2. Sophomore Leah Craig had a career weekend, potting two goals and one assist in the first game and four goals in the rematch. Teammates Lindsay Hansen and Nicole Hekle also lit up the scoreboard, combining for 11 points over the two games.

Providence, meanwhile, salvaged a weekend set by picking up a 4-1 win Sunday against visiting Colgate after tying up the Red Raiders, 1-1, in the opener.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: BC's first-ever matchup against BU's varsity squad was clearly a new beginning in the rivalry. Facing BU in all but one of the past 11 Beanpots, the Eagles outscored the Terriers' club team 81-6 over those 10 games. They jumped out to an early 3-0 lead against the varsity team last Tuesday, but the Terriers stormed back to tie it, and outshot the Eagles 5-1 in overtime.

Boston University: Erin Seman had the game-winning goal Sunday in the Terriers' first-ever Hockey East victory ... The Terriers are unbeaten at Walter Brown Arena, posting a 2-0-2 record at home ... All but two players who have dressed for the Terriers have recorded a point.

University of Connecticut: Goaltender Kaitlyn Shain has stooped 105 of 110 shots over the first three games of the season, giving her a save percentage of .955 on the season ... UConn cracked both national polls last week, coming in as the nation's 10th ranked squad.

University of Maine: Kelly Law's goal in OT vs. UConn Saturday was the first and only shot taken by either team in overtime. In Sunday's game vs. NU, the Black Bears and Huskies combined for six shots in OT, but neither team scored.

University of New Hampshire: With four assists this weekend, Lindsay Hansen moved into a tie for 10th place on UNH's career assist list with 79. Nicole Hekle recorded her 50th career assist with a two-assist effort on Friday ... Rookies Sam Faber and Angela Taylor both scored their first collegiate goals Saturday at Niagara ... The Wildcats' power play is clicking at 9-for-22 (.409) through three games.

Northeastern University: NU has not won in overtime since Nov. 14, 2003, against Clarkson. Since that game, NU is 0-5-11 in overtime games ... Ten of the 16 goals Northeastern has allowed this season have either been on special teams or with an empty net (5 PP, 2 SH, 3 EN) ... NU has allowed just two goals in the first period this season ... NU's junior class has registered seven points, all assists, over the last three games.

Providence College: With Sunday's 4-1 victory over Colgate, seventh-year head coach Bob Deraney earned his 125th career win.

University of Vermont: The Catamounts ended an 11-period scoreless streak with Hilary Johnson's goal 10:20 into the first period of Saturday's game vs. BU ... Vermont out shot BU 27-3 in the first period on Saturday, but only had 36 shots over the next five periods against the Terriers.

COMING UP

This coming week's schedule is all over the map, literally, as Hockey East teams will be in action all over New England, and in Buffalo, N.Y. Boston College and Vermont will compete against both Niagara and Princeton in Buffalo this weekend. Niagara is fresh off back-to-back losses against UNH, so the Purple Eagles will likely be looking for revenge against Hockey East.

Elsewhere, Boston University will put its recent successes on the line, travelling to Dartmouth on Saturday. But first, Northeastern will host BU once again, marking the second of three league games they'll play against one another this year. The first, on the season's opening weekend, went in favor of Northeastern 4-3. But since then, the two teams' fortunes have gone in opposite directions, as BU is undefeated in its last six games (3-0-3) while Northeastern is still looking for its second win of the season.
