DEFENDING CHAMPION FRIARS LEAVE CALLING CARD *BU ends seven-game streak but BC remains undefeated*

A loss and a tie to open the season left some scratching their heads about the fortunes of three-time defending Hockey East champ Providence. But the Friars erased doubts this past weekend, getting big contributions from the usual suspects en route to a sweep of Northeastern, 5-1 and 6-1. 2004-05 Player of the Year Karen Thatcher led the way with three goals and three assists while defenseman Kristin Gigliotti potted two goals of her own and matching Thatcher's three assists.

Overpowering visiting Sacred Heart in a two-game set, Maine netted 20 goals and allowed only two. Brigitte Laflamme and Vanessa Vani totalled seven points each in the series to set the electrifying offensive pace for the Black Bears.

Boston University's wild run of seven games without a loss ended Saturday when the Terriers finally met their match at sixth-ranked Dartmouth. Down 3-0, the Terriers attempted another improbable comeback, a trademark of their first varsity season, but fell one goal short at 4-3. Caroline Boudreau had two goals and set up the other in the loss. Wednesday's 4-2 win at Northeastern was led by blueliner Amanda Shaw, who scored twice.

BC is still undefeated at 2-0-3 on the season thanks to two more ties this weekend in Buffalo, N.Y. Vermont came up just short against the same opponents, losing 3-1 to Niagara and 2-1 in OT to Princeton.

UConn and UNH both split their weekends, with UNH swapping home wins vs. Brown. UConn's Kaitlyn Shain shut out Yale Saturday, but was bettered by Quinnipiac on Sunday, 3-2.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: The Eagles have started the season with a five-game undefeated streak ... Junior Krystal Strassman scored the lone goal against Niagara, marking her first point of the season.

Boston University: The Terriers played their first ranked opponent in program on Saturday, dropping a close 4-3 decision at No. 6 Dartmouth. It was their first loss since the season opener, breaking a seven-game undefeated streak.

University of Connecticut: Freshmen Kristen Russell and Nicole Tritter each lodged her first collegiate point this weekend, and Russell finished the weekend with four points total, including her first career goal ... Kaitlyn Shain's 3-0 shutout was her first of the season, but eighth of her career.

University of Maine: Cheryl White's five-point weekend doubled her point total for the season ... Maine's defense allowed just six shots in Sunday's 8-1 win over Sacred Heart, a new school record. Saturday's 12 goals was their highest-ever total against a D-I opponent. In the record setting win, 10 Black Bears earned at least two points each ... Maine is 5-0-1 at home so far.

University of New Hampshire: Junior goaltender Melissa Bourdon recorded her second career assist Sunday at Brown ... UNH trailed for the first time this season, in its fifth game, when Brown took a 2-1 lead in the third period on Sunday. The home team has won each of the last six meetings in the UNH-Brown series ... UNH owns the first period this season, outshooting opponents 68-18 and outscoring them 11-0 ... Martine Garland has recorded a point in all five games this season.

Northeastern University: Crystal Rochon's power play goal in the third period on Saturday broke an 0-for-25 string on the man advantage for NU ... The junior class has scored eight of NU's 13 goals ... NU has allowed more special teams goals (16) than even-strength (15) and has only been outscored 15-13 in even-strength play.

Providence College: The Friars have allowed only one goal in each of their last four games, while increasing their goal output in each ... Providence dominated special teams play in a 6-1 win vs. NU Sunday, going 5-for-10 on the power play while keeping the Huskies scoreless on 12 chances.

University of Vermont: Sophomore defenseman Kate Lesniak potted her first career goal Sunday, the only UVM goal in a 2-1 OT loss to Princeton ... 17 different Catamounts have registered at least one point so far this season.

COMING UP

Every season, Boston College seems to get at least a notch or two better as the program continues to build. Modestly undefeated at 2-0-3 to start this season, BC has a big test on tap with a home-and-home series against UNH this weekend. The Wildcats were the only Hockey East squad that BC failed to record at least one win against last year, so ringing up a victory vs. UNH is probably on the Eagles' To Do list. This year's preseason favorite is off to another hot start at 4-1 and is determined to wrestle the Hockey East tournament title away from Providence.

The Friars boosted confidence this past weekend by sweeping Northeastern in a home-and-home series, and hope to extend that confidence into a huge game at top-ranked St. Lawrence on Saturday. Providence and Northeastern both play at SLU and at Clarkson.

In other non-conference sets, BU will look to get back on the winning track with two games at Rensselaer, while UConn faces off for two at Wayne State. There is also one home set in Hockey East, as Robert Morris plays two at Vermont.
