ROOKIE GIVES EAGLES FIRST-EVER WIN VS. UNH

Vermont defeats Robert Morris 3-1 for first win of season

Another first for Hockey East happened this past weekend as the Boston College Eagles capitalized on strong efforts from their first line and from their goaltender to record a 3-2 overtime win over preseason favorite UNH. It was the first-ever victory for the Eagles vs. the Wildcats, ending a 32-0-2 run for UNH, including a win in Friday night's opener.

UNH goaltender Melissa Bourdon was perfect on Friday at home, stopping all 13 Eagle shots she faced for her 13th career shutout, 3-0. She stopped 13 more in Saturday's rematch, but was victimized by the skills of BC's first line, which accounted for all three goals in the overtime win. Sophomores Sarah Feldman and Deb Spillane each scored once, and connected to set up rookie Becky Zavisza's game-winner. Alison Quandt, the Hockey East Player of the Week, stopped 21 of the 23 shots she faced. Sadie Wright-Ward was the only goal-scorer in the game for UNH, picking up two goals vs. Quandt.

The University of Vermont finally got on the winning track, picking up its first win by defeating Robert Morris, 3-1. Kristi Anderson had a goal and an assist to help the Catamounts to their first victory since ending a three-game winning streak late last January.

UConn's Kaitlyn Shain did everything in her power to pick up a win, but stopping 27 of 28 shots faced at Wayne State wasn't quite enough as the Huskies could not score and suffered a 1-0 loss on Friday. In Saturday's rematch, freshman Brittany Wilson got her first career start, but the Huskies dropped another one-goal decision, 3-2.

Northeastern and Providence were swept on a shared visit to the North Country, each yielding to Clarkson and St. Lawrence. The top-ranked SLU Saints battered NU and Providence with a combined 105 shots over the two games. Northeastern workhorse Marisa Hourihan made that game interesting by stopping 54 of the 57 shots she faced in a 3-0 loss.

Boston University entered the weekend with a respectable 4-2-3 record, with one of the losses a 4-3 decision at Dartmouth. But a visit to Rensselaer switched the Terriers fortunes, as the Engineers prevailed in back-to-back games, 7-3 and 5-3. Nicki Wiart had a goal and two assists in the series, having a hand in half of the Terrier goals.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College: The first line of Sarah Feldman, Deb Spillane and Becky Zavisza led BC to its first-ever win vs. UNH. Each had a goal in the 3-2 victory. Feldman and Spillane set up Zavisza's OT game-winner. They notched 10 of BC's 16 shots on goal and combined for a +5 rating. The trio is expected to play together when the Hockey East All-Stars faceoff against Team USA on December 11.

Boston University: The Terriers will play the last of a seven game road trip on Saturday, Nov. 12 at Connecticut. BU has not played a home game since they tied Boston College 3-3 on Oct. 18... The BU penalty kill has a 91.8 success rate, while the power-play unit has scored in nine of 11 games this season. Nine different players have scored at least one power-play goal this season ... The Terriers are outscoring opponents 16-7 in the third period... Kelley Karnan has three goals on six shots this season ... Sarah Russell and Maeghan Ouimet each scored her first career goal last week.

University of Connecticut: Freshman Brittany Wilson made her first career start in goal on Saturday, stopping 19 of 22 shots.

University of Maine: The Black Bears were idle this past week, but travel to Providence for a two-game set this coming weekend. Maine's lone win in its all-time series vs. Providence came in November 2003.

University of New Hampshire: UNH did not allow a BC shot in the third period of Friday's shutout. That marked the second time this year that the Wildcats held an opponent shotless in the final frame ... UNH allowed a first-period goal for the first time this season Saturday at BC. That game also marked the first time this year that UNH did not score the first goal of a game ... UNH already has two short-handed goals this season, matching the team's total from the entire 2004-05 season. The 'Cats also have at least one power-play goal in all seven games this season and are an impressive 15-for-45 overall.

Northeastern University: Colleen Sanborn scored her first career goal to put NU up 1-0 against Clarkson on Saturday. It was just the second first period goal for NU this season ... Crystal Rochon had the other goal, extending her goal streak to three straight before SLU shut out the Huskies on Sunday ... Hourihan's 54 saves at SLU Sunday marked just the third-highest in her career, behind a pair of 57-save performances last season. She now has five games of 50-plus saves in her career.

Providence College: Karen Thatcher is ranked first in the nation with three short-handed goals. Last season, the team tallied four during the entire season. Thatcher needs only two points to reach the 150-point milestone for her career.

University of Vermont: The Catamounts doubled up Robert Morris in terms of shots-on-goal, out shooting the visitors 68-34 in a split weekend series ... Sunday's win was Vermont's first at home since Jan. 22 of last season and first overall since Jan. 29 of last season ... Senior Caitlin Barnes has recorded an assist in each of the last three games.

COMING UP

After recording its first-ever win vs. UNH on Saturday, Boston College heads into Tuesday's game vs. Dartmouth with plenty of confidence. The two teams are more closely matched than ever before and Boston College is bent on breaking into and staying in the national Top 10. Later in the week, both BC and UNH will visit Yale, another team flirting with Top 10 status.

The rest of the action on the weekend will all be in league play, and the standings are sure to shuffle.

Maine will play two at Providence. The Friars are 19-1-2 all-time against the visiting Black Bears, including a four-game sweep of last year's series. The only win for Maine came just two seasons ago, however, and one of last year's losses came in overtime.

Elsewhere, Boston schools BU and Northeastern swap games against Connecticut and Vermont. Northeastern is at home for both, hosting UVM in a Saturday night primetime event and UConn on Sunday afternoon. The Terriers, currently in first place in Hockey East, visit UConn on Saturday afternoon and host Vermont on Sunday.
