### VERMONT GETS FIRST LEAGUE WIN VIA SHUTOUT *Friars get the best of Maine in weekend set*

One week after recording their first win of the season, the Vermont Catamounts have picked up another, this time in league play, a 1-0 win at Northeastern Saturday.

Vermont goaltender Shivaun Siegl was perfect in facing 27 shots. At the other end, NU's Marisa Hourihan was almost perfect, turning aside 27 of 28. Looking for a sweep at BU on Sunday, Siegl was touched for three goals through two periods, two by Hockey East leading scorer Laurel Koller, as the Terriers skated on to a 3-1 victory, keeping their perfect home record intact at 3-0-2 and salvaging a split on the weekend.

Split was the order for four different Hockey East teams. Vermont won at Northeastern but lost at BU. BU beat Vermont after dropping a 3-0 decision at UConn the day before. Kaitlyn Shain stopped the Terriers cold on 20 shots. The host Huskies (NU) recovered from the shutout against Vermont to drop the visiting Huskies (UConn) on Sunday, 3-2.

Only Providence was able to muster more than two points in league play this past weekend, picking up a win and a tie vs. visiting Maine. Sonny Watrous put the finishing touch on the series with a goal at the 8:48 mark of Sunday's game, her second of the game, giving the Friars the 4-3 triumph. Maine's Cheryl White scored two power play goals in the opener, a 3-3 tie, while Black Bear defensemen Kelly Law and Julie Poulin each had three assists in the series.

Yale had to endure some of the wrath of Hockey East over two games on the weekend. On Saturday, the determined Bulldogs could only put one goal past BC netminder Johanna Ellison, who finished with 37 saves in a 1-1 tie. Sunday, the visiting UNH Wildcats poured on the offense, with two goals and one assist from Jennifer Hitchcock, en route to a 5-2 victory.

## TEAM NOTES

**Boston College:** When last week's polls were released, the Eagles found themselves ranked in the top 10 for the first time in program history, positioned at No. 10 in the weekly USA Today / USA Hockey Magazine poll.

**Boston University:** The Terriers maintained their unbeaten streak (3-0-2) at Walter Brown Arena with a 3-1 victory over Vermont. It was the first home game for the Terriers since a 3-3 tie with Boston College on Oct. 18, ending a streak of seven straight road games ... The BU penalty kill continues to dominate, allowing only seven goals on 86 chances, a 91.9% kill rate ... Saturday's 3-0 loss at UConn marked the first time the varsity Terriers have been shut out.

**University of Connecticut:** Kaitlyn Shain's shutout of BU Saturday was her second blanking of the season and ninth of her career of the season and the ninth of her career ... The freshman class was responsible for nearly half of UConn's offense on the weekend, credited for five of the 11 points.

**University of Maine:** Five of Maine's six goals at Providence this weekend came with the man advantage. Maine now has 18 power play goals on the year, just three shy of last season's total ... The Black Bears have 39 goals through nine games this season. Last year, they had only 18 goals in the first nine games. 16 different players have scored at least one goal this year.

**University of New Hampshire:** UNH is 6-0 when scoring three or more goals in a game and 6-0 when surrendering less than three goals this season ... UNH opponents have averaged just 14.6 shots per game this season, including a season high of 21 by Brown (Oct. 30) ... Sadie Wright-Ward leads the 'Cats with five multiple-point games this season ... UNH's nine-member sophomore class has accounted for 23 of the team's 36 goals (64%) ... The UNH power play has scored more than one goal in five of the team's nine games this season.

**Northeastern University:** The NU penalty kill is perfect over the last 12 chances, having shut out three straight opponents' power play units ... Five different forwards have scored NU's last five goals ... Ashley Bielawski's second-period goal Sunday snapped a scoreless streak of 183:37 for Northeastern.

**Providence College:** Kristin Gigliotti is currently on a six-game point streak and ranks third nationally among defensemen with a 1.22 points per game average ... Senior captain Karen Thatcher currently has a nation-leading four short-handed goals this season. The entire team produced only four short-handers all last season.

**University of Vermont:** With a goal vs. BU Sunday, senior Hilary Johnson moved into a tie for fourth place on the all-time Catamount scoring list with 45 points for her career ... Four of Vermont's top five scorers this season are seniors ... Sophomore Caroline Donahue has stepped up for Vermont this season, with a team-leading three goals this season. She had only one goal in 27 games as a freshman ... Before BU's three goals in the second period Sunday, Vermont had gone six straight periods without allowing a goal.

UConn's first trip to Boston wasn't exactly what the team hoped it would be – a 3-2 loss at Northeastern on Sunday. Connecticut will return to Boston for two games this coming weekend, testing the merits of two teams proving tough at home.

On Saturday, the Huskies visit Boston College, where the Eagles have posted wins over Quinnipiac, Maine and even UNH. Only Dartmouth has managed a win at Conte Forum, posting a 3-2 victory last week. On Sunday, UConn takes on the Terriers, who are thus far undefeated at home (3-0-2). It will be a rematch of this past weekend's contest, which ended in favor of the host Huskies, 3-0.

BU also faces Providence this coming weekend in a battle of the two teams currently atop the Hockey East standings. Saturday's match in Providence will be the first-ever meeting between the two squads.
