### PROVIDENCE SWEEPS TO MOVE INTO FAMILIAR FIRST PLACE *UConn salvages weekend trip to Boston with 1-0 OT win at BU*

The three-time defending Hockey East champion Providence College Friars lost their first league game of 2005-06, 3-1 to Connecticut, but have since reeled off a six-game undefeated streak (5-0-1) in league play to return them to the top of the league standings. This past week, they dominated games against Vermont (6-1) and Boston University (4-0), who had enjoyed first place until going head-to-head against Providence. Kristin Gigliotti, Ashley Payton and Karen Thatcher each had two points in each of the two victories to lead the offense.

The top offensive player of the week, however, was UNH's Nicole Hekle. Despite boasting 31 career goals over her first two seasons, the junior captain didn't get her first career hat trick until Saturday at Northeastern. She added two assists in the game to finish with a five-point night, anchoring an 8-2 win for the Wildcats. Rookie blueliner Kacey Bellamy had a goal and two assists in the game and Leah Craig scored twice.

UConn also played in Boston, taking on BC on Saturday and BU on Sunday. UConn's Kaitlyn Shain allowed only two goals on the weekend, both in Saturday's game, and ultimately suffered a 2-1 loss at the hands of the Eagles as BC limited UConn to just 10 shots on goal. She was even more determined Sunday at BU, stopping all 20 shots she faced and ending up with a deserved 1-0 shutout win when teammate Samantha Reid scored at the 2:38 mark of overtime. That soured a solid 34-save performance for BU goaltender Allyse Wilcox at the other end.

Rensselaer brought an impressive 9-0-1 record into a two-game weekend set at Maine. Unimpressed, the host Black Bears dealt the Engineers their first loss of the season by a 4-1 final on Saturday. Maine's Danielle Tangredi scored one and set up each of the three others. In the rematch, the teams skated to a 2-2 tie.

## TEAM NOTES

**Boston College:** Freshman Becky Zavisza is tied for the BC lead with six goals this season. She has scored the game-winning goal in three of BC's four wins.

**Boston University:** Allyse Wilcox has made 30 or more saves in five of her 12 starts this season. She is second in the country with almost 756 minutes played ... At 90.2, The Terriers have the best overall penalty kill among Hockey East teams and are fourth-best in the nation ... The overtime goal by UConn was the first OT goal allowed by the Terriers. BU is now 0-1-3 in overtime games this season.

**University of Connecticut:** Kaitlyn Shain's shutout Sunday was her third of the season and 10th of her career. She has four wins this year, three by way of shutout ... UConn is perfect on the penalty kill in Hockey East play this year, boasting a 24-for-24 run over their first six games.

**University of Maine:** The Black Bears remain undefeated at 5-0-1 vs. non-conference opponents this season and 6-0-2 vs. all opponents at home ... For first time this season, Maine was perfect on the penalty kill in consecutive games, going 16-for-16 on the weekend. The power play contributed three goals this weekend and has 21 on the year.

**University of New Hampshire:** 12 of the 16 UNH skaters dressed in the Wildcats' 8-2 victory at NU recorded a point, and seven finished with multiple points ... Seven different Wildcats are averaging at least one point per game ... UNH has scored the game's first goal eight of nine times this season and is 7-1 in those contests. The Wildcats have outscored the opposition 16-1 in the first period thanks to a 112-35 shot advantage ... The Wildcats have scored at least one power-play goal in every game this season and have scored multiple power-play goals six times ... Leah Craig has just 32 shots on goal, but 10 of those have gone in for goals.

**Northeastern University:** Freshmen Colleen Sanborn and Courtney O'Connor each registered their first assists in an NU uniform in Saturday's loss to UNH ... NU has just one power play goal in conference play, while opponents have scored 12 power play goals and three shorthanded tallies.

**Providence College:** Defenseman Kristin Gigliotti has an eight-game point streak ... The Friars are undefeated at home this season with a 5-0-2 record ... Senior Karen Thatcher needs only six points to become the 14th Friar to reach the 150-point career milestone.

**University of Vermont:** Sophomore goaltender Jenilee Roy saw her first action in the 13th game of the season and got her first start in the 14th, last Thursday at Providence ... The Catamounts offense has struggled with one goal or less in 11 of 14 games this season, going 1-10 in those games. In the three games they have managed two goals or more, they are undefeated (1-0-2) ... Vermont plays six of its next seven games at home.

## COMING UP . . . .

The pool of contenders in NCAA women's ice hockey has greatly expanded this year. Hockey East, dominated in the recent past by UNH and Providence, has added at least four more teams to that mix this season. This coming weekend will provide a good glimpse as to how well the league stacks up against the others as several marquee non-conference matches are on tap.

Connecticut has the toughest draw of any team, a two-game set at top-ranked St. Lawrence. Almost all of the others will be facing off against opponents that have at least merited consideration for the Top 10 polls.

Like UConn, Maine faces a two-game away weekend, skating at North Dakota for the first time ever. Former Maine assistant Shantel Rivard is in her fourth year as head coach of the Sioux.

Providence will host ECACHL rivals Brown and Yale. Brown is fresh off a big weekend in which it beat Dartmouth and tied Harvard. Facing the same opponents, Yale defeated Harvard but lost to Dartmouth.

UNH will travel to Dartmouth for the weekend, but won't face the Big Green. The Wildcats will instead focus on a Sunday faceoff against Wisconsin following Saturday's exhibition game vs. Ottawa.
