### SWEEPS WEEK FOR HOCKEY EAST

#### UNH beats No. 1 Wisconsin; Three other teams sweep in non-league play

The No. 1 team in the nation took a hit yesterday when UNH limited Wisconsin to just one goal on 16 shots en route to a 2-1 win. That completed a 3-0 week for the Wildcats, who also shut out Northeastern 2-0 in league play and overpowered Ottawa 6-2 in an exhibition match. All-around commitment to defense was the winning recipe, but Becky Peters (1-1-2 vs. NU), Samantha Faber (3-2-5 vs. Ottawa) and Melissa Bourdon (15 saves vs. Wisconsin) had the most notable individual performances. Defensive Player of the Week Nicole Goguen was a +4 with one assist on the week as one of several players that contributed to a dominating defense that allowed just 33 shots on goal over the three victories.

Three other teams swept two-game sets in non-league play. Providence upped its win streak to five straight with triumphs over old guard rivals Yale (3-1) and Brown (5-3). The first line of Ashley Payton, Karen Thatcher and Sonny Watrous dominated the sweep, contributing five goals and 11 assists. Kristin Gigliotti scored a goal in each game to extend her point streak to nine consecutive games, while fellow blueliner Meredith George potted her first career goal in Saturday's win.

Maine outlasted host North Dakota in back-to-back games, limiting the Sioux to just one goal in the set. Genevieve Turgeon opened the series with 23 saves in a 2-1 win and Rachel Gettings completed the sweep with a 22-save 2-0 shutout.

Boston University got back on the winning track with two victories vs. Robert Morris. Cara Hendry scored three power play goals and two assists, while Allyse Wilcox stopped 31 of 33 shots faced over the two contests.

## TEAM NOTES

**Boston College:** BC is 4-1 at home this season, but remains winless away from Conte Forum at 0-2-4.

**Boston University:** The Terriers outscored Robert Morris University 98-35 and outscored RMU 8-1 in the weekend sweep... BU's first line scored six goals and recorded six assists over the weekend... There were 44 penalties called over the two games, creating 35 power play opportunities. BU was 6-for-19 with advantage and 14-for-16 on the penalty kill ... Junior Eden Spencer made her first D-I appearance in Sunday's win.

**University of Connecticut:** Senior Kaitlyn Shain has recorded 116 saves over the past two weekends, including a career-high 49 in Saturday's 4-0 loss at St. Lawrence ... UConn's 10 shots on goal Saturday tied their lowest total on the season, which came against Boston College on Nov. 19.

**University of Maine:** With a clean sweep over North Dakota, Maine remains undefeated in non-conference action (8-0-2) ... Rachel Gettings is perfect at 3-0-0 this season, including Saturday's shutout at North Dakota ... Maine has scored two goals or more eleven times this season and is 7-2-2 in those games.

**University of New Hampshire:** Sunday's game vs. Wisconsin was the Wildcats' first game against a Top 10 opponent this season. It was only the second time head coach Brian McCloskey has faced a No. 1 team ... Brittany Busa has three shutouts in seven career starts ... UNH has surrendered more goals in the third period (eight) than the first two periods combined (six) ... The Wildcats' defensive unit stymied last week's opponents by allowing a total of 25 shots over the two games ... Nicole Hekle and Kacey Bellamy were named to the Dartmouth Classic All-Tournament team.

**Northeastern University:** Marisa Hourihan's 52-save performance Tuesday marked her sixth career game with 50 or more saves, three of which have come against New Hampshire ... NU is 0-14 vs. UNH since the two schools joined Hockey East at the start of the 2002-03 season ... The NU defense has held four of its last five opponents to three goals or fewer, but the offense has only scored a total of three goals in those games.

**Providence College:** The first line of Ashley Payton, Karen Thatcher and Sonny Watrous combined for five goals and 11 assists over two victories this past weekend. Payton has scored at least one goal in the last four games and also has six assists in that span. Thatcher now needs just two points to reach 150 for her career ... Defenseman Kristin Gigliotti had a goal in each of the two games this week to extend her point streak to nine straight games ... The Friars remain undefeated at home this season with a 7-0-2 record.

**University of Vermont:** The Catamounts travel to Connecticut on Thursday and then play their next five straight at home ... Sunday's 1-0 loss vs. Quinnipiac marked the fourth time this season that Vermont has been shut out.

## COMING UP . . . .

It's a busy week for Hockey East as all eight teams are in action, spreading eight league games and 11 games total over a six-day span.

Providence puts its five-game winning streak on the line Tuesday, welcoming Harvard to Schneider Arena. The Crimson isn't nearly as dominant as it has been in the past, but Harvard is still a ranked team. Following that, the Friars have two tough league games on the road: Saturday at Boston University and Sunday at Boston College.

With just one loss in its last 10 games, Maine will be a challenge for host Northeastern in a two-game weekend set that could have significant playoff implications. Neither team qualified for the Hockey East playoffs last year, and this year's expansion to eight teams will make getting there that much more difficult.

Led by two players with ties to Hockey East, the Women's U.S. Olympic team defeated Canada yesterday, 2-1. Former BC assistant coach Katie King scored the only goal in regulation for Team USA, setting up a shootout to settle a 1-1 tie. Former Northeastern stopper Chanda Gunn made 27 saves in the game and stopped all four shots she faced in the shootout. Team USA will face off against a team of Hockey East All-Stars on Sun., Dec. 11, at UNH.
